New Railway Mainline Plotted Through Town Telephone Poles Being Staked Out

The route of the CNR's relocated main line is being plotted through Georgetown this week as a CN telegraph crew survey and stake out the new positions for the telegraph poles which will run parallel to the new track part of the huge Toronto Terminal project in which Georgetown, a junction, will play a key part.

As the construction work moves closer to Georgetown, John L. Cann, project director, reports this progress:

- The Highway 7 bridge just west of Keele St. has been completed and work on Thursday, November 9th, 1961, now are spreading a granular base prior to paving.

- The Keele St. bridge north of Steeles Ave. is completely and handling traffic.
- The bridge carrying Highway 400 traffic over CN's right-of-way will be completed in two or three weeks.
- Workmen are pouring the concrete decking slabs on the Yonge St. bridge.

Mr. Cann also reported that the grading of the 1200-acre freight classification yard north of Steeles Ave was 25 per cent completed — or that 1,000,000 cubic yards of earth had moved since work started on the project in April of this year.
