Test School Children At Tuberculosis Clinics

More than 30,000 children will receive tuberculosis tests at clinics now being held in Halton County public and high schools. It is expected that 45,000 adults will also receive the test in a survey which continues until mid-December. The survey is sponsored by the Halton County Tuberculosis Association in cooperation with the Ontario Dept. of Health. "Once a disease that killed thousands annually, tuberculosis nowadays seldom results in fatalities," said William Benson, Acton, president of the association. "Early detection and prompt medical attention have reduced TB cases to a fraction of those previously treated." The survey executive is Dr. A. F. Plants, head of the health department.
