The trout was taken Oct 17th and Kitty Strite at that time measured 14% inches Bonnie Brandford Cecil noticed that his trout wore a Season High Singles Dopt Tag No. 132500 And upon re-Kitty Strite turning said tag to the Dept he was Gloria Jones informed that this particular fish Jovce Rundle was tagged at Silver Creek, near Collangwood, on June 5th, 1961 And at ...
