"Let's clean up this beautiful town and adopt as our slogan 'I'm from Georgetown, the best town in the world,'" he urged.

**AIMS AT MAYORALTY**

After ten years on council present reeve Doug Sargent said he feels he has the background for the mayor's job which he is seeking. "As presiding officer, he said, he would try to have councilors exert their best efforts and work as a team. "I think we can maintain the present tax rate by only increasing absolutely essential debts, and I promise to get the best mileage from your tax dollar," he said.

**HITS AT CRITICS**

Obviously irked by remarks of Councillors Brown and Cass, Mayor Hyde came back with retortations as he announced he would run again for mayor. "There has been mention of tapes and secret police. The secret police Mr. Brown referred to is the Criminal Investigation Bureau of the Ontario Provincial Police which worked here for a month or more and our own local police were informed about this situation as far back as May or June," he said. "The councillor who talked about secret police is the same one who was on a committee which circulated pamphlets this year suggesting Georgetown was an East-view or a North York." "Georgetown is one town which is washing its dirty linen from the inside, not the outside," he noted.

"Mr. Cass mentioned a von ditza," he said. "There is none here. Delrex Development has been offered the same consideration as everyone else under our subdivision control by-law. As for a budget deficit, we had a contingency fund of \$30,000 which was to be used where needed, and the \$21,000 from Delrex Development has no effect on our budget at all because it is earmarked to help retire sewage plant debentures." "I'll admit I sat on council four years and didn't do anything about it, but it has been pointed out to me now and we shouldn't let prospective industrialists drive over roads like this," he said. "You may not like me, but you need me," he challenged ratepayers.

He criticized a Delrex agreement which provided no penalties, Main Street centre lighting, and payment of Winter Works employees at a higher scale than town workmen, and urged a town manager.
