(continued from page 1) . . . he stated. The chairman told of the sudden death of a teacher, Mr. Lloyd Doan, hired only two weeks ago, in a car accident at Stratford. Mr. Doan was a relief teacher at Glen Williams and Stewarttown. In conclusion Mr. Coles hoped that everyone would agree that the inclusion of the whole township in one area was a great forward step. With Mr. R. J. Cunningham's speech signs of friction in the school board became evident. He was opposed to the inclusion of an auditorium in the new Limehouse School as he felt the township was unable to pay for such a luxury. He expressed concern about the financial standing and wanted about getting too deeply in debt. He forecast an increase in the mill rate for public schools, despite increased assessment. Mae Sprowl pointed out that no school board can get approval for new buildings unless they prove to the Dept. of Education that the need exists. He listed the many repairs to the schools in the area. The teachers' salaries range from a minimum of \$3,000 to a maximum of \$5,500 he told the meeting. "Keep Off the Grass" Asked at Hospital A thoughtless habit is causing grave concern to local hospital authorities regarding the grounds surrounding the building. Due to lack of financing a minimum of sodding was done, but quite large areas of the grounds were seeded. The grass came along very well, and it was expected that next spring the grounds would be a credit to the hospital and community. Unfortunately during the very mild fall, numbers of people have persisted in walking across the soft turf, thereby destroying a great deal of the work accomplished, and almost certainly marring the prospects for the spring. Everyone is urged to cooperate in this and help to keep the grounds as beautiful as possible. With ample parking, as well as ample paved roads there is no excuse for the thoughtless actions of people by abusing the property designed to beautify the hospital.

**Dead Trees Will Be Replaced**

A tree planting program initiated this year by town council was not as successful as hoped.

Some 26 of the trees have died, Cr. Ian C. Hill council Monday, and blamed a late season dry spell for the casualties.

However, trees will be replaced at no cost by the suppliers in the early spring, he added, with a hope that the 1962 council will continue the plantings inaugurated this year.
