Sargent Defeats Hyde As Georgetown Mayor

Elliott, Hunter Head Reeve, Deputy Poll

Doug Sargent, a council member for ten years, is Georgetown's new mayor.

Mr. Sargent defeated incumbent mayor Ern Hyde by 146 votes Monday in a 2-man contest. He is completing his fourth term as town reeve, was deputy reeve for two terms before that and in 1960 was Halton warden.

Deputy Reeve John Elliott had an outstanding day at the polls when he topped Cr. Ian Cass by 636 votes to succeed Mr. Sargent as reeve. Cr. Wm. F. Hunter won by 234 votes over Cr. Bob Burke for deputy reeve.

Council Voting

Council voting was by ward for the first time in 20 years. In Ward 2 a present council member Jim Emmerson and a past councillor Fred Harrison led the polls all the way in a 3-man race with Robert Letts. Five men contested the two Ward 3 seats, with Robert McNeilly and Cr. Jim Brown successful over Jack Critchlow, Wilfred Brisbois and Martin Horan.

Ward 1 councillors, Don Barrager and Rex Cook, and Hydro Commissioner E. W. Binkley had already been given acclamations to office.

Opinion Split

The election saw a definite opinion split between east and west parts of town, and as returns filtered in.
