#### MANDAMUS ACTION DISMISSED

A mandamus action against the town of Georgetown was dismissed by Hon, Justice G. A Gale, after a hearing in Chambers at Osgoode Hall on Friday. The action was brought by

Seabee Homes Ltd. to force the town to issue a building permit for a house on Jessop Court. The street is an area of the Delrex subdivision on which building is precluded at present until a ratio agreement made in 1954 between the town and Delrex Developments Ltd. is met.

It was the second such mandamus action in recent months. A similar application by Rex Heslop Homes Ltd. was dismissed earlier this year as was an appeal launched by that firm.
