Recently council has received complaints of burning rubbish at the sanitary landfill site in the eastern industrial area and council's public works chairman Don Barrager was asked to investigate. Cr. Barrager reported on Monday to council that Bob Lane, who has the contract for landfill is keeping a close eye on the property. "He's as anxious as we are to eliminate trouble, but there are troubles sometimes with children lighting fires and with people dumping garbage at the site after hours," said the councillor. The former location was fenced and a gate kept locked, but this did not work because people dumped refuse in front of the gate, he said. It is better to allow access to the site after hours so dumping will take place in the proper place and garbage covered the next morning, he believes.

STREETSVILLE
A population of 20,000 is required before commuter train service can be seriously considered by the Canadian Pacific Railroad. This was reported to village council last week by Roy Burbank of Toronto who appeared to discuss tentative future development of agricultural land beyond Streetsville limits.

FERGUS
At a meeting of the Grand River Conservation Authority last week it was decided almost unanimously to go ahead with the next step in the long range program to build more dams on the Grand River. As a result a \$7,700,000 dam will be built at West Montrose near Fergus.

BURLINGTON
An annual tax rate of more than 80 mills would face residents of the area north of No. 5 Highway if they succeeded from Burlington, Town treasurer Don Farmer said this week. From time to time residents of the area have talked secession but no detailed study had ever been made of the financial result of such a move.

ORANGEVILLE
