Mansell Nellis Gets Snow Plowing Contract

At a brief Esquering Council meeting last week, Mansell Nellis of Acton, was awarded the tender for snow ploughing in the township.

Of the three tenders submitted, his was the lowest. Mr. Nellis will be paid \$8 per hour while ploughing, and \$8 a day per machine, stand-by time. The contract runs from December 15th to March 15th.

A second tender — this one to provide the excavating and granular base on the Norval road running north from the Hollywood Hotel to the bridge, was awarded to D. Barber of Hillsburgh at a cost of \$2,432.50. This expenditure will be shared with Chinguacousy Twp. The welfare costs listed in the interim statement were higher than the actual costs, clerk K. C. Lindsay, told council. For the eleven months of this year, the costs were \$16,422.00. However, charge-back to other areas, and government grants, combine to reduce the township's cost to \$2,386.



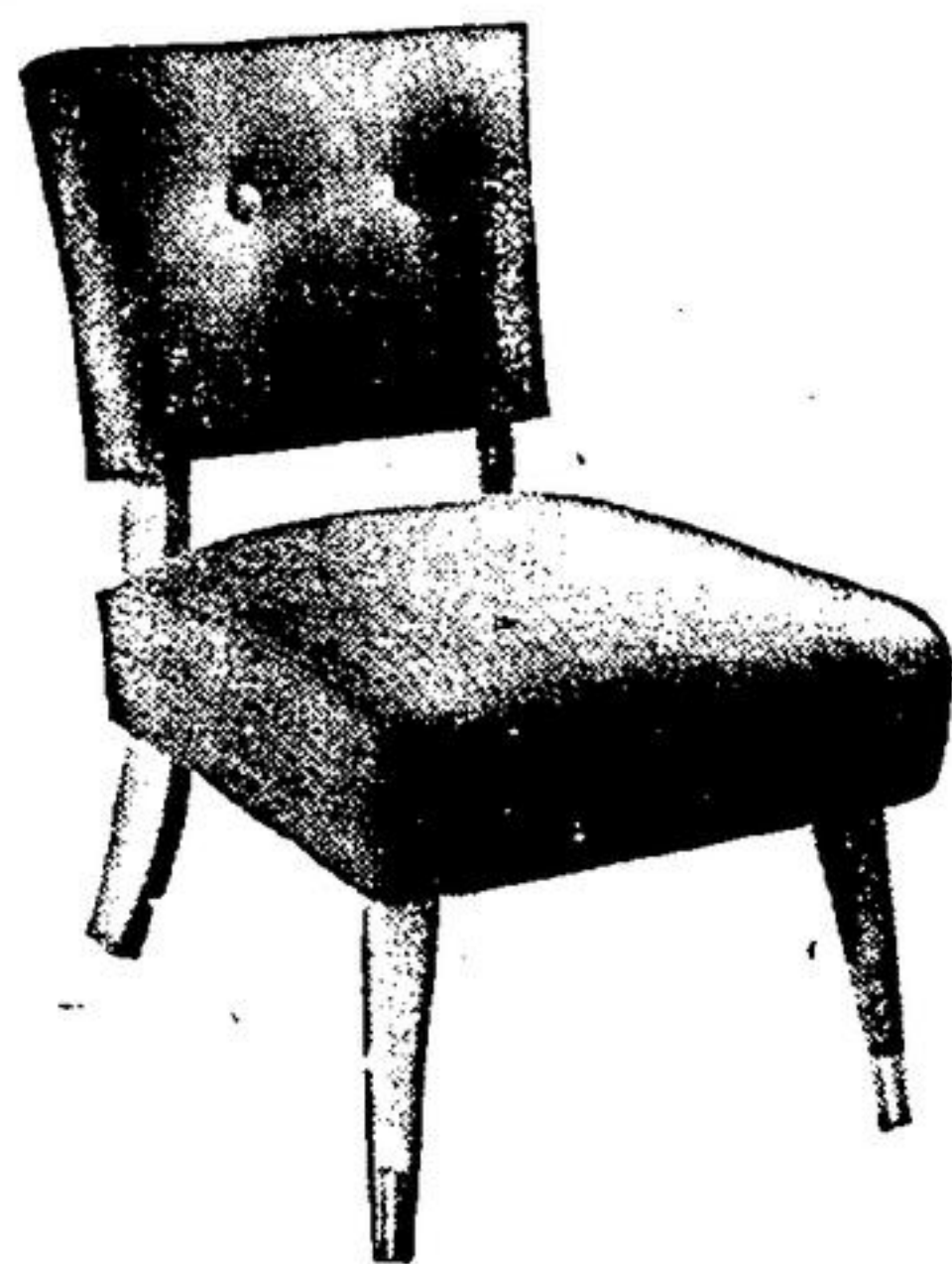

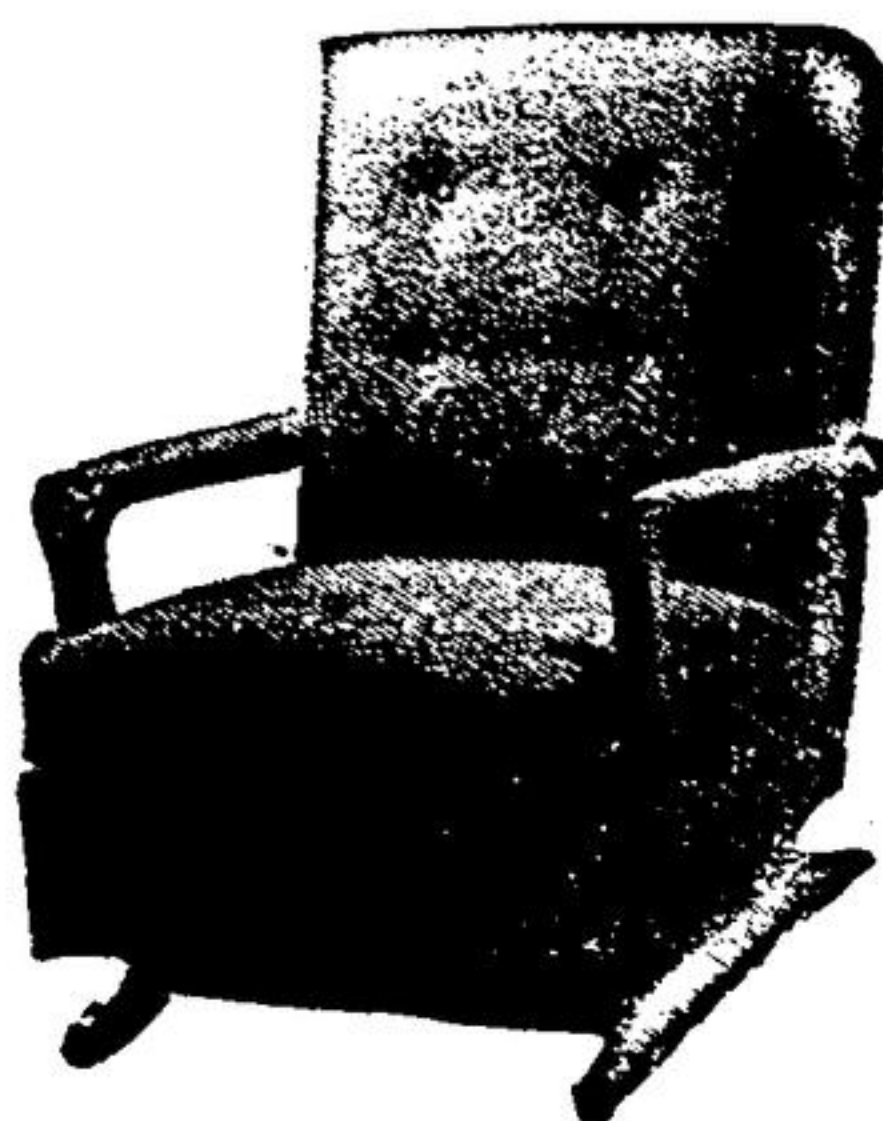

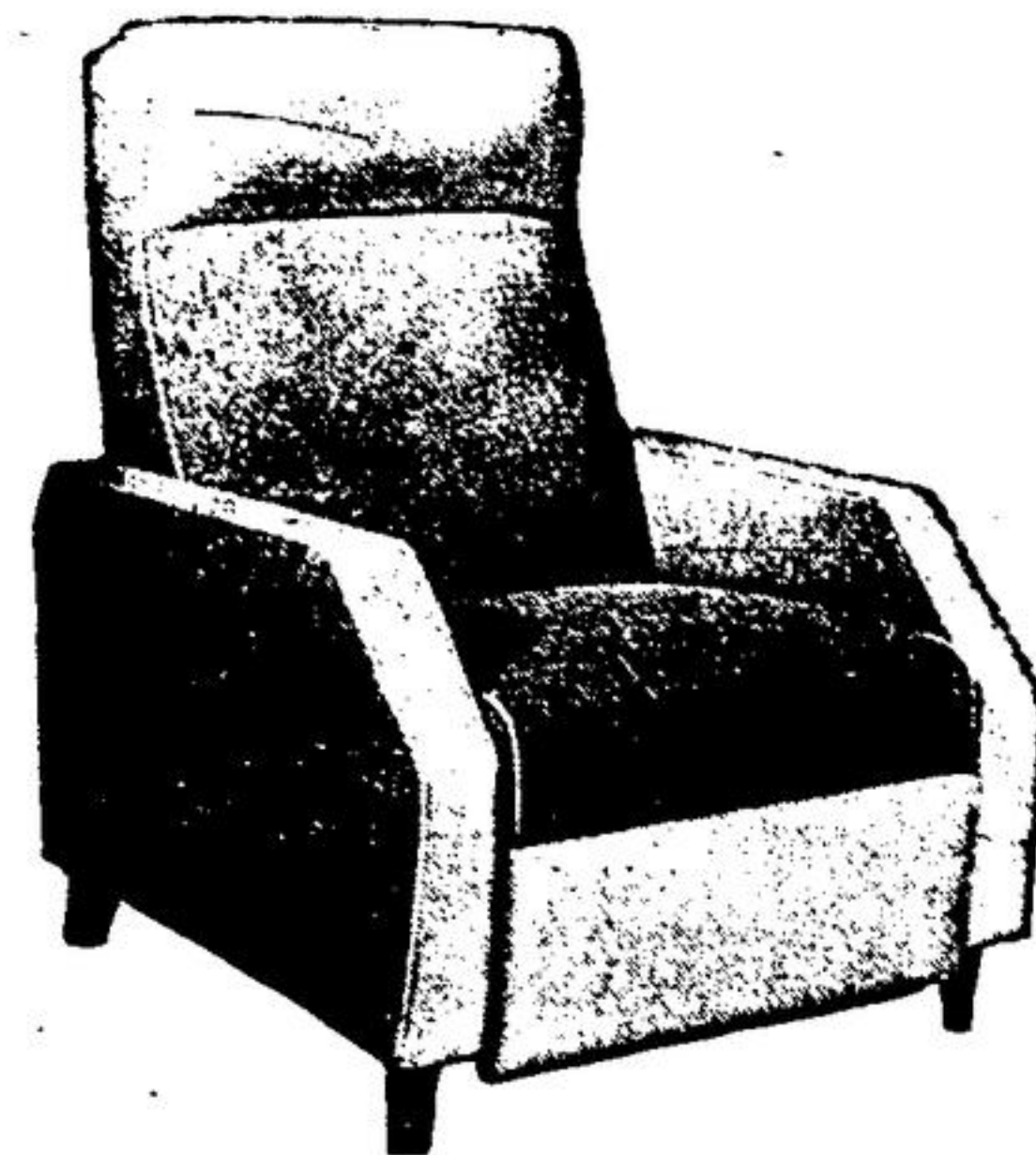
