Raiders Out to Gain Intermediate 'A' Lead

This week's award for the most improbable observation goes to inactive Raider Nick Ferri who claimed after watching Milton Merchants outbomb Georgetown Raiders 9-7 here Thursday night that he had just watched the weakest team bearing the Merchant name in years.

None of the local club officials in immediate earshot offered the obvious argument.

Georgetown had to come off the floor to notch the win. Milton scored two quick goals, the first at the 4:07 mark. Haslett from Shuker and Constantine, and the second at 5:42. Newton unassisted, and owned a 2-1 lead at the end of the period. George Grassy scored the Raiders' only goal at 11:38, but Bruce McFadden came back with the final Milton tally at 13:38.

Equalized
Two Raider goals equalized things in the middle frame. Dunn scored from Bob Demers and Moe Galland at 13:32, and Demers levelled it off with his marker on 13:55 from Gal-

land at 14:07. The winner was Junior Beaumont's goal from Bob Bingham and Blake Inglis after the third period was just two minutes and 38 seconds old, everything after that was just a garnish. Demers from Dunn at 4:37, Beaumont again from Galland at 16:55 and Richardson unassisted with 3 seconds to go in the game.

Split Series
The Raiders split their four game Toronto-Milton series straight down the middle Sunday when they lost to the Toronto Macedonians 3-1 after winning 4-1 in their first game here.

Hughes from Comport and Nash combined to put Toronto ahead at 14:20 of the first period. There was no scoring in the close checking second period but the Macedonians widened the gap early in the third. Flemming scoring from Wall and Red Stevens at 4:40, and McNeal from Bell and Nash at 6:49.
