## Sign Galt's Vasey To Raider Defence

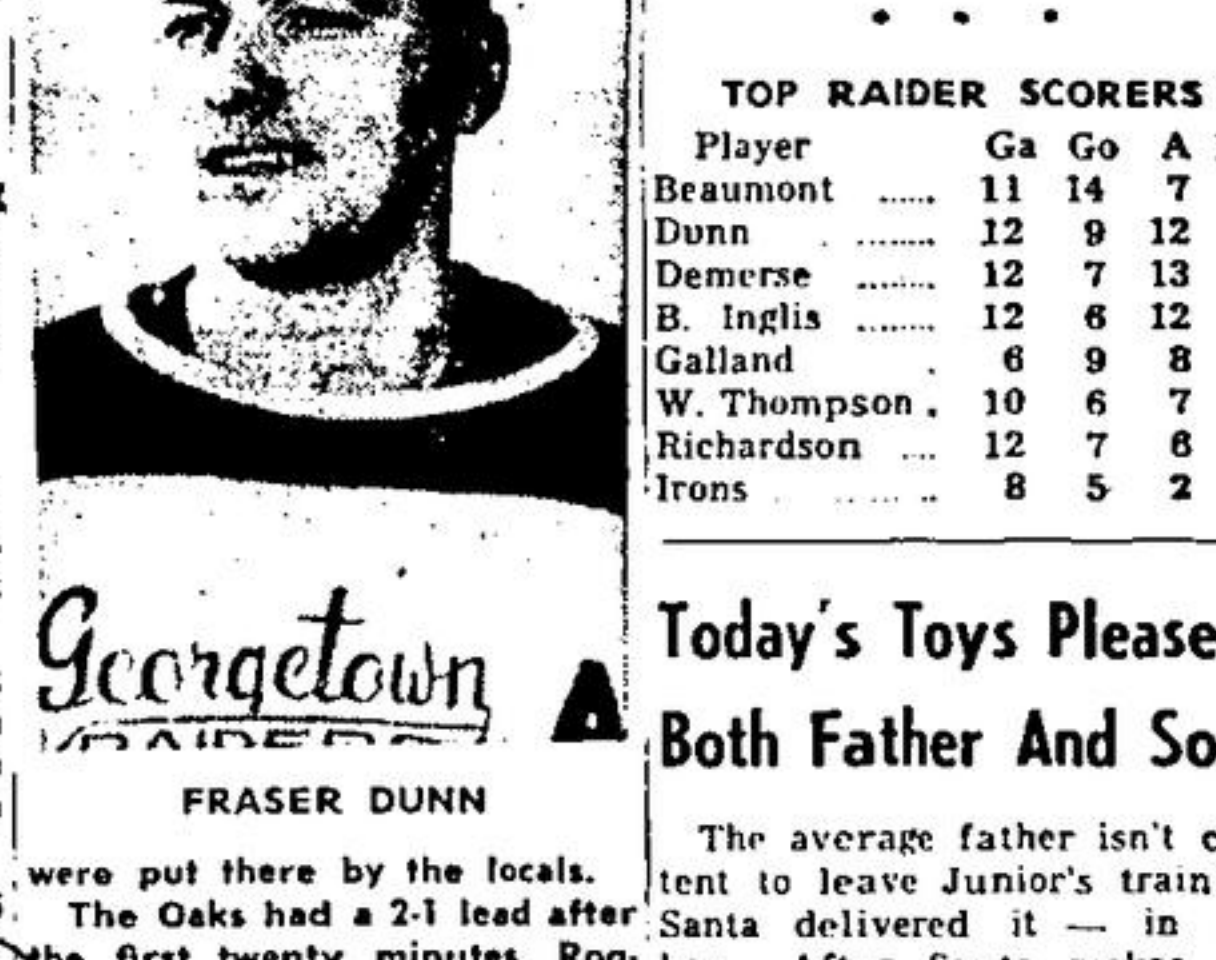
### Nip League Leaders 7-4 Friday's Game

The fact is the Raider hierarchy would be happy with one more top flight rearguard to give the team the balance it needs to be a consistent winner and latest rumblings out of club are that Santa got their letter. Stated to don red and white garb (St. Nick's colours) sometimes during the yule season is one Garnet Vasey of Galt Terrier fame who appears to be the much wanted package. To make room for Vasey, who is already signed, the Raiders had to drop Mark Mills, which won't cause much head shaking, mainly because since he inked a playing card about 7 games ago, he has turned up once.

Mills was part of the evacuation from Ralph-Clark-Stone, a Toronto mercantile club which also yielded goalie Pete Kelly and sniper Moe Galland. Of the trio, Galland is the real find.
