Call Us Any Time

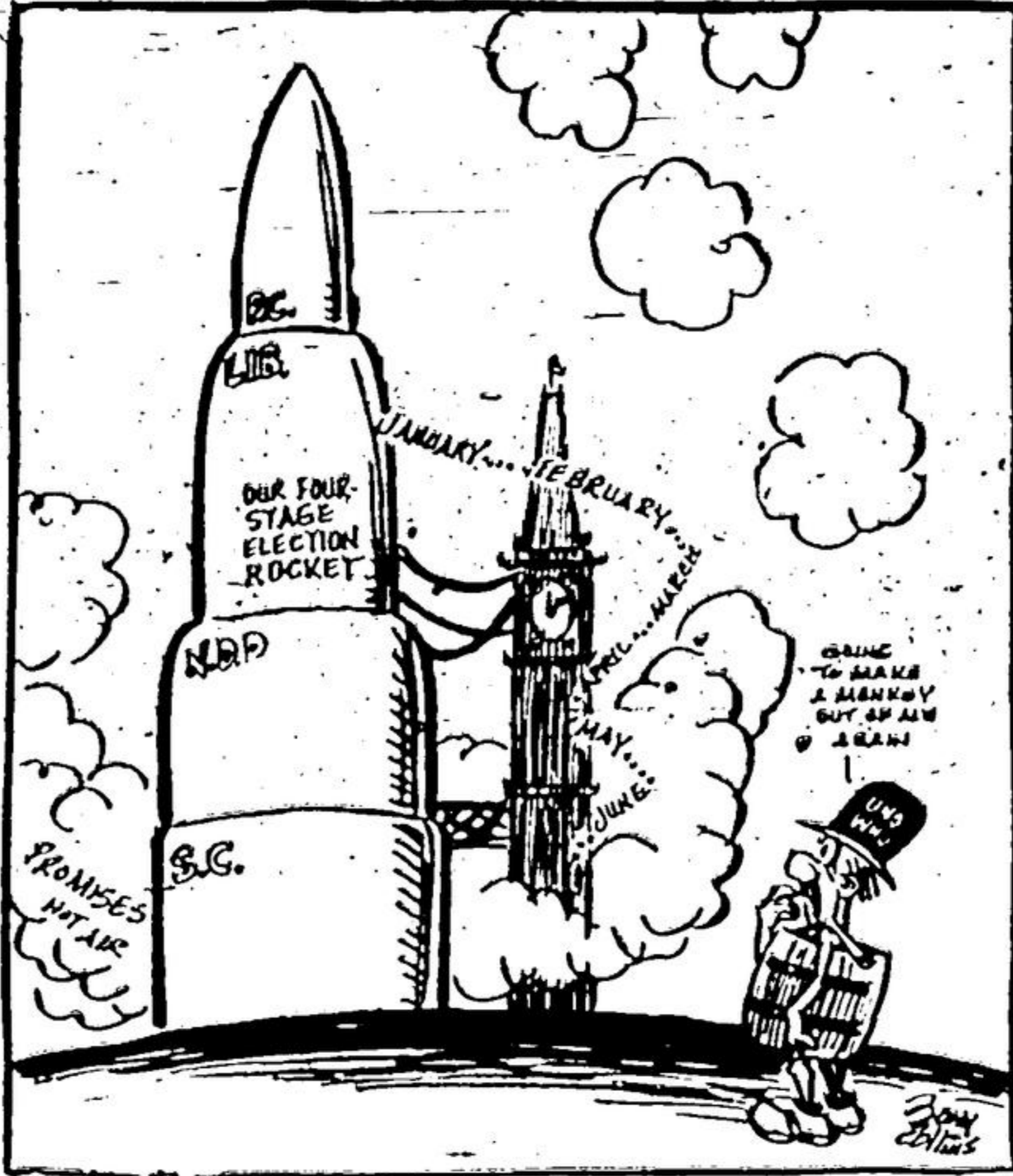
The larger a town grows, the more we find readers reluctant to call in the items which are one of the backbones of a weekly newspaper - the 'personals'.

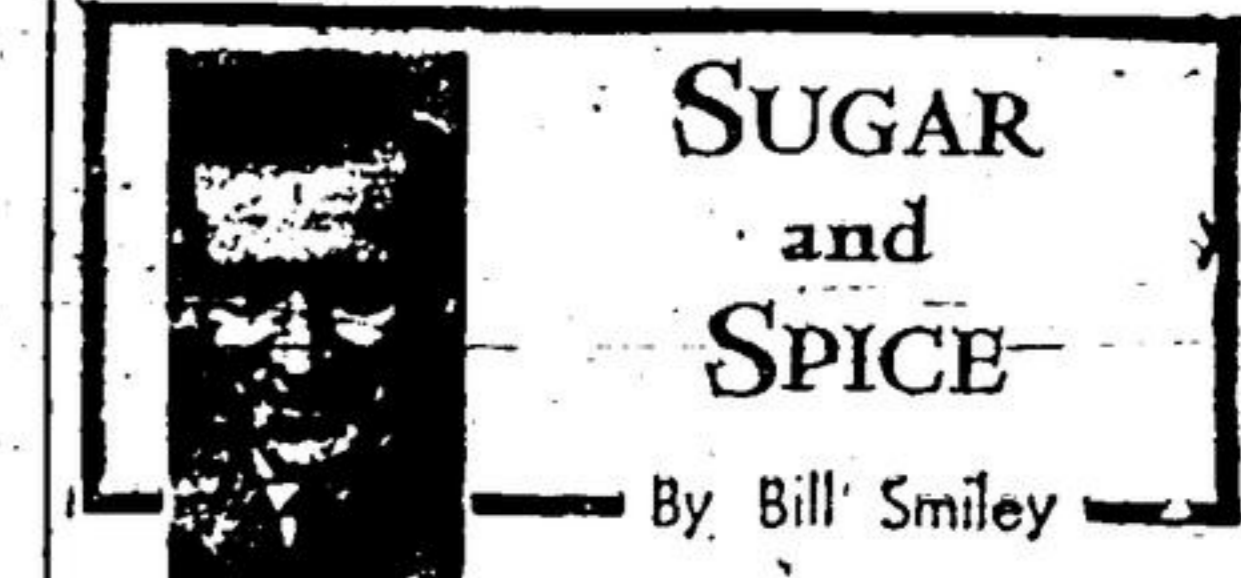
