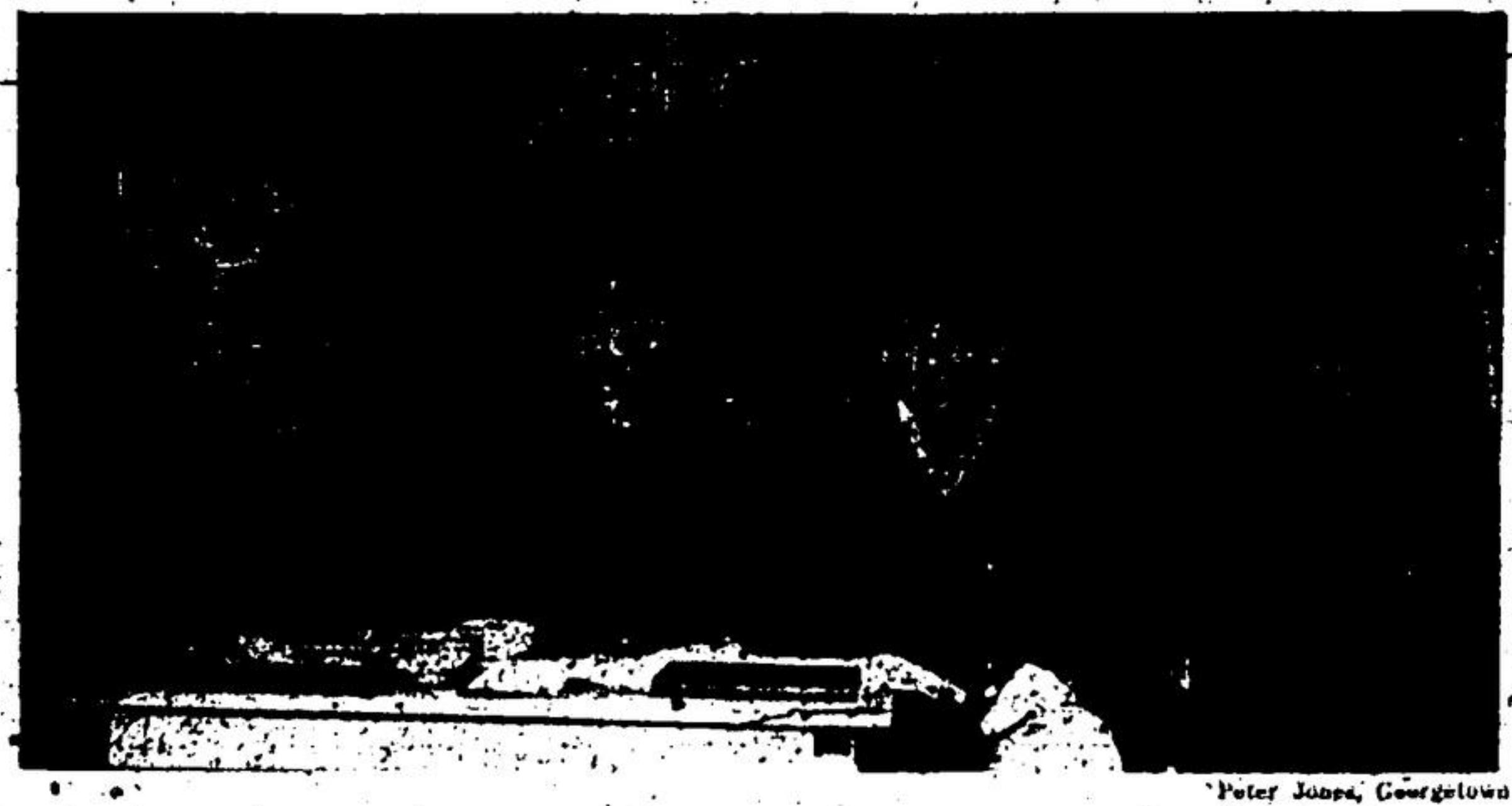

## Tie, Win, Lose Raider's Week

### Look in Second League Position

Georgetown Raiders and Bradford Fords still can't finish their ice business cut and dried.

The clubs locked horns for the first time in the 1961-62 campaign back in November and came out of that with a deadlocked game to be decided later. And now, after their six point week-end, doubt still surrounds the results.

Here Friday the teams played the ten minute overtime with out scoring to clean up the November puzzle, which ended in a 6-6 tie, and then Raiders headed their way to a decisive 9-2 triumph to take 3 of the possible 4 points at home.

In Bradford Saturday the Fords rolled to a 3-0 victory over the red shirts, but it was this one that produced another quality.

Bradford used Bobby Hazard the ex-Leaf, whose playing card they dropped early in the season to get an extra waverer. Hazard has written the OHA about the illegal member and are waiting for the Bradford win to be washed out.

No matter how the OHA rules on it the locals are still riding in second place in the Central Ontario Hockey League, five points back of the Toronto Macdonalds and two ahead of Oakville Oaks, and the Fords who are tied for third.

A couple of key stops by Raider goalie Barry Smith, saved the ten minute tie for the Raiders who skated stronger as the game went on.

Bradford held a slight edge and deserved their 2-1 lead at the end of the first period but Raider Coach Elmer Lee dictated what followed. Before the second period General Lee told his boys they were playing like the body check went out with long skirts.

Results—Raiders started bumping blue bodies in the middle period and kept it up while poking in 8 more goals.

Forhan and Nicholas rocketed their club into a 2-0 lead with an explosive scoring outburst around the fifteen minute mark while Joe Auger converted Fraser Dunn's pass into Raiders first goal with 6 seconds left in the period.

Five different snipers swept Bradford aside in the rough second period, Galand, Blake Inglis, Beaumont, Falby and Richardson. And of these quiet, methodical rearguard, Doug Falby stole the show with the prettiest goal of the week.

Raiders were pressing. Falby took a clearing pass, at the Bradford blue-line, shifted two would-be checkers out of their skates and rifled the shot into the top right corner of the net.

Fraser Dunn joined the parade after just 26 seconds of the third, and Richardson and Beaumont came through with repeat efforts to bury the Fords.

Forhan again scored the first goal, Nicholas again scored the second goal as Bradford followed the same pattern and took another two goal lead. And Raiders (again) scored with less than a minute to go in the frame. But this time it was Richardson instead of Auger at the 10:20 mark.

The similarity ended after Blake Inglis tied it up at 7:12 of the second. Boyer from Hazard enabled Bradford to skate off with a 3-2 edge at the end of the second and Georgetown couldn't stay with them in the topside finale. Vasey scored twice, Boyer, Hazard and Cosburn once to lift the surpris-

ly sparse Bradford crowd Wayne Thompson gave Raiders the last word at the 19 minute mark.

Doug Richardson actually scored another Raider goal but it won't show up in the record book. Richardson's marker was disallowed by the official who said it didn't count in that section was what happened. The puck slid across the line and out under the back of the ice in the scramble. The Bradford goal judge put the light on and play stopped, but the referee, who had his back turned, called it no goal.
