Borrowing For This Year? Harrison Asks

—Last year Reeve Elliott said council would end the year approximately \$4,000 to the good. Do current borrowings cover only the first eleven days of this year or are we borrowing to cover some of last year's business? was the provocative question asked by Cr. Fred Harrison at council meeting last Thursday.
