

### Norval Men Rescue Child From Drowning

A tragedy was narrowly averted on Sunday afternoon when 8 year old Marilyn Robinson of Willow Park, Norval, fell through the ice where the West Branch joins the Credit River and the current is very fast.

Fortunately some grownups were enjoying the skating nearby and heard the little girl's screams and quickly came to her rescue. She was hanging on to the ice with the current pulling at her and to watch her over the thin ice Mr. Kerdyjalen lay down and pulled her to safety with the assistance of Norman Shea.

We hope other children will not venture where the ice is not safe as this accident could have had a different ending if it had happened on a week day and grownups not near.

In our memory there has never been a drowning in the village by falling through the ice. We can recall a few narrow escapes but no tragedies, so hope that we can keep this record.
