Ottawa, Ont.: Three internationally known track and field personalities from England will conduct the first track and field clinic for coaches every held in Canada.

Mr. Justice Mervyn Wood, Regina, Dominion President of the Royal Canadian Legion, today announced that under the Legion's expanded track and field program, Geoffrey Dixon, John Disley and John Savidge of England will give a "weekend" course to be held at the Ontario Agricultural College in Guelph starting August 23. Some 75 coaches from various parts of Canada will be invited to attend with the Legion providing transportation.

Coached British — Geoffrey Dixon was the chief national coach to the British Amateur Athletic Association from 1947 until last year. He coached the British teams in three Olympic Games and numerous other international competitions. He has also directed many annual coaching clinics in England.

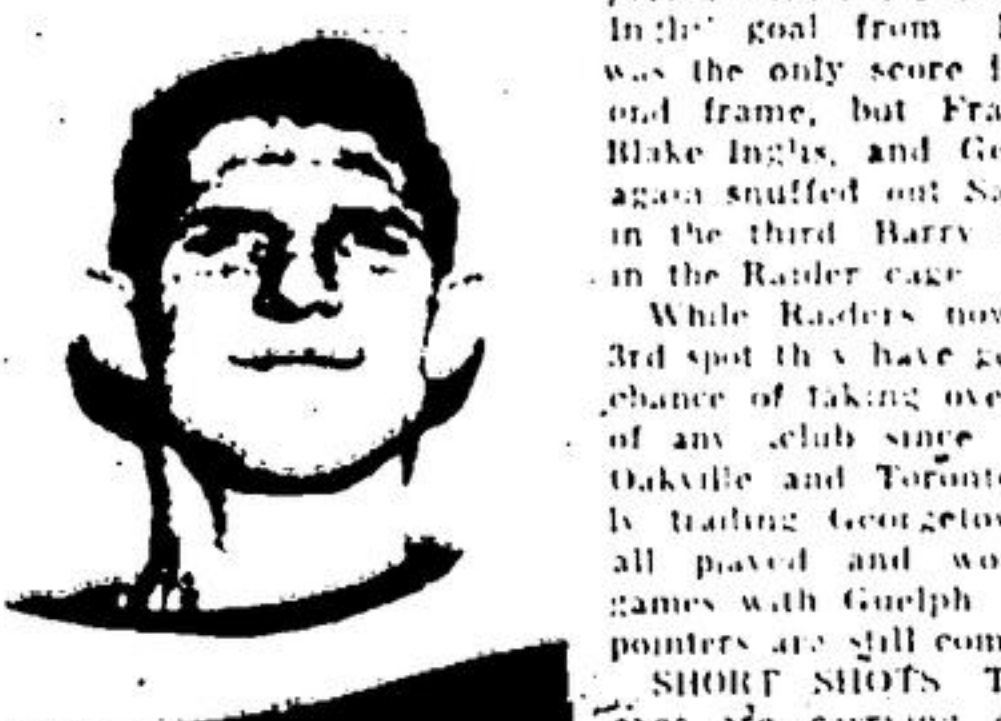
