

Employment Office, in Georgetown Once a Week

The National Employment Service, which serves Georgetown and district from its Brampton office, is planning to have a branch office operating in town one day each week.

The service, which also handles unemployment insurance, was granted a request on Monday by the town council to locate in the Municipal Building on a day to be decided by the two parties.

In his letter, Charles Fraser, district manager, said that another convenience for Georgetown residents has been the "implication" of a district phone line from town to Brampton. The line will eliminate any toll charge being paid on calls from town to the main office.

Mayor Sargent expressed council's satisfaction with the decision.

"For some time we have been trying to have a branch office located here and this is at least partial success," he said.

Pedestrians Must Note Traffic Lights

Pedestrians who walk against the red light at Main and Mill corner may now be slapped with a fine for as much as \$100.

Section 70, paragraphs 11 and 12 of the Highway Traffic Act, those which deal with crossing against the traffic signal, went into effect here last week.

Pedestrians now, to avoid being fined, must cross only on "green" to the act states. Some have been ignoring the signals and crossing the busy streets on amber or red.

Fines for a first offender may be from \$5 to \$50, and for a second offender \$10 to \$100.

The Georgetown Police Department has not forced the traffic light law as it applies to pedestrians up until now to allow people to become used to obeying the lights.

4-H Forestry Club Organized in County
