

Galand Sparkles With Six Goals in Friday Tilt

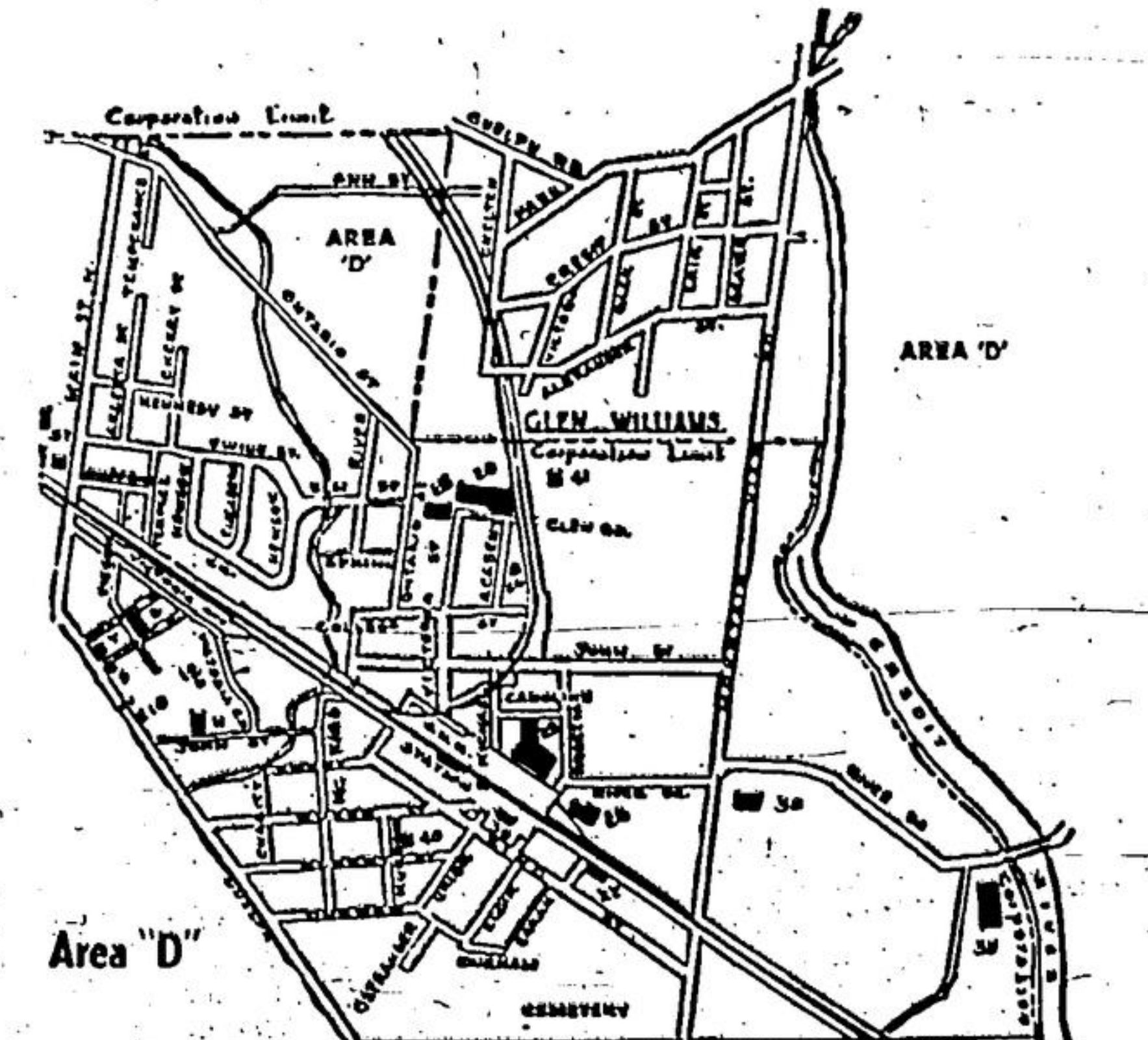
