

# Two Girls' Titles For Basketballers

For the third consecutive year the Georgetown District High School girls have won the District 6 Basketball Championship titles in both Junior and Senior divisions.

In a back-to-back encounter with Milton last week, Georgetown girls on their home court outscored their opponents in the Senior game 47 to 14 and in the Junior game 40 to 14.

Captain Betty Quackenbush led her Senior squad to victory scoring 17 points, Bonnie Smith for 15, Carol Higham 9, Diane Dutchburn 4 and Pam Fyrie 3. A stellar defensive game was turned in by guards Lesley Brown, Pat Barrager, Sharon Sykes and Pam Currie. Unable to solve the Georgetown defense, Milton forwards potted only five field goals and four foul shots.

Junior captain Leslie Quackenbush had an off-day on her own shooting, scoring only 7 points, but set up numerous plays for Diage Pennock, who was high with 18 points and Bev Handel with 12. Pat Cook accounted for the other 3. The guard line of Janet Murray, Jennifer Mills and Carroll Farnell was particularly effective in clearing the boards of rebounds.

**Win Again**

In the first games played at Milton, play was more spirited if more ragged with numerous fouls called. Georgetown came out on the long end of the score in both games with the Seniors winning 28 to 17 and the Juniors 42 to 9.

Both squads now face a home and home series with the team from Guelph Catholic High School, District 3 champions. The winners of this series earn the right to participate in the CWOSSA "B" Championship tournament on February 24th at O.A.C. Guelph. The G.D.H.S. Junior girls are defending champions, having won the title last year by defeating Guelph Notre-Dame and Delhi District High School teams in the tournament finals.

# Room-Rent Objection Because Hotel Strike

Rental of a room at the Royal York Hotel for local delegates to the Ontario Good Roads conventions took a labour twist at Monday's council meeting when Cr. Bob McNeilly opposed it because of the employees' strike at the hotel.

"I'm opposed on two counts," said the councillor. "If delegates want a room they should pay for it themselves, and because of the hotel strike I feel renting a room is opposing the union involved and I want no part of it."

"I'm surprised at Cr. McNeilly bringing in the union into the discussion. It has nothing to do with the idea at all," said Deputy Reeve Hunter.

Mr. Hunter said he had been at the convention last year and paid his own way and intends to go again this year, whether the town took the bill or not.

"The deputy is entitled to his opinion and to an 11" insisted Cr. McNeilly, who voted against the motion.

Cr. Harrison pointed out that next to education, roads is the biggest item on the town budget and important information can be gleaned by attending the convention.

"I made the motion because I feel the delegates forfeit their time and must pay for their meals and it is time the town paid a share for them at least," said Cr. Rex Cook.

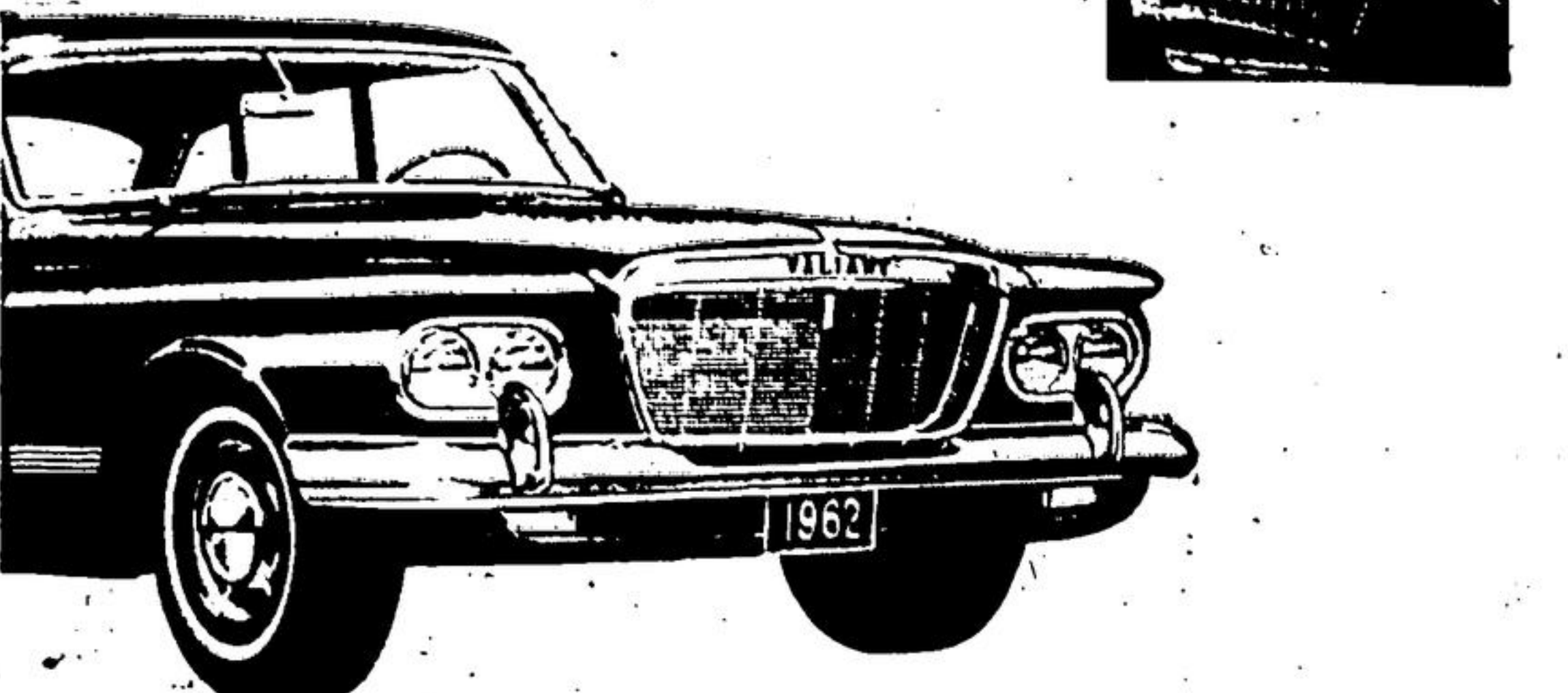
