### Service Building Is Planned At Cemetery

Provision of a service building at Greenwood Cemetery was indicated in a letter read at Monday's council meeting from the Cemetery Board. The board, in requisitioning its share of town taxes, said that a minimum of \$8,000 would be required in 1962 because of the projected building. "The board has been quite cooperative in the past in reducing its budget wherever possible," remarked Mayor Sargent. Asked by Cr. Harrison on what basis tax money is advanced to the cemetery, the mayor said that at one time the board received a one mill allotment, but there is some area of doubt whether this is statutory. For the past two years, council has asked the board to requisition its requirements each year.
