## First Place? Not Quite Raiders End in Third Paired With Guelph in League Playoffs

The Central Ontario Hockey League's stretch drive came within an eye of turning into a three team photo-finish Sunday. Instead Oakville and Bradford ended deadlocked with 55 points apiece while Georgetown Raiders slipped over the last obstacle in their march to the top and lost out to the Toronto Maroons 5 to 3. Had Raiders won the game, and they did everything but, they would have had 55 points but would have been the first place team on a "goals for and against" basis.

It's been the Georgetown four game all the way on the COHL merry-go-round. Every time Raiders have come close to making a grab for the brass ring they've fallen off the horse and who they happened to be playing at the time didn't make much difference.

Sunday it was the fourth place Toronto Maroons, the club Raiders had blanked 70 less than 48 hours earlier. 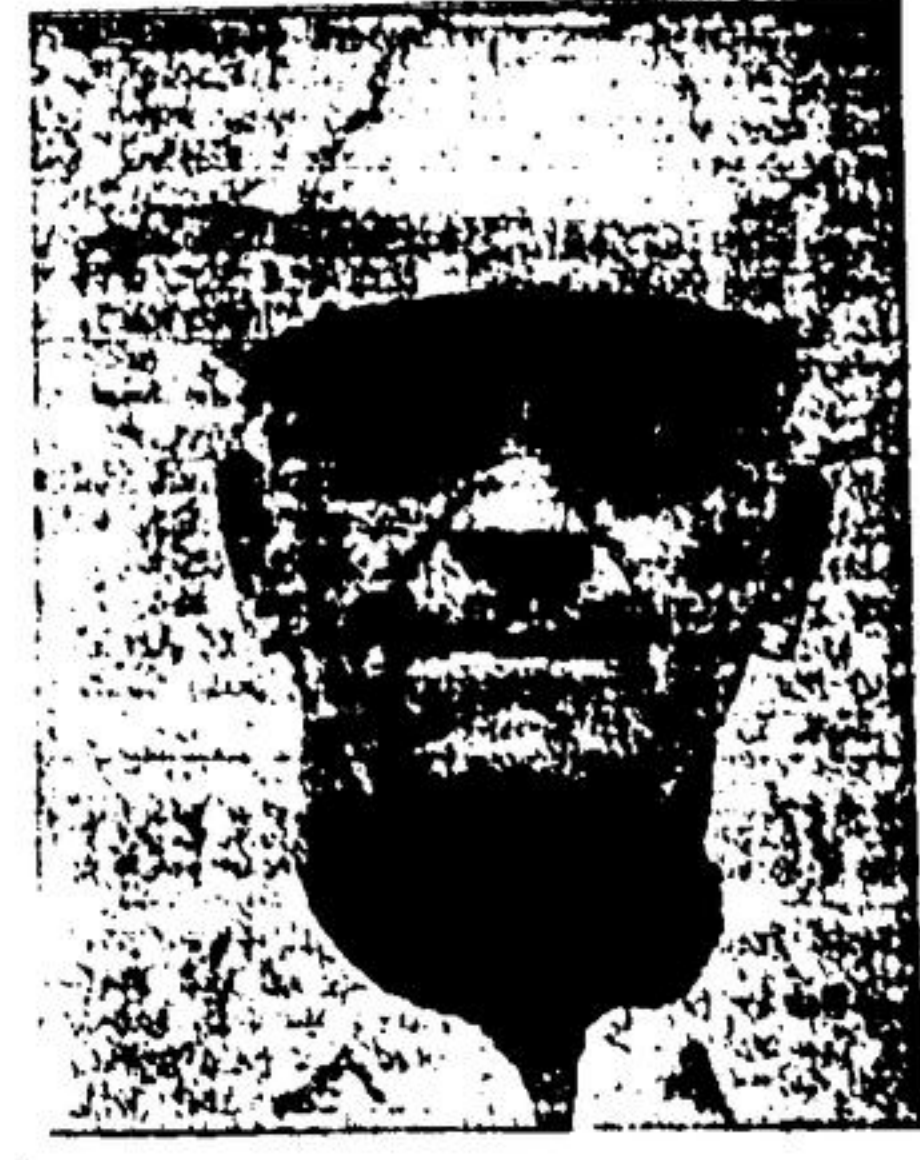
