Raiders Rock Brad's Fords Series Shifts Here Friday Night

Thompson, Beaumont, Inglis-Notch Goals

Georgetown Raiders, showing no bad effects from their ten day layoff, went into Bradford Community Centre Arena Tuesday night and knocked the home town Fords back on their collective heels with a gilt edged 3-1 win in the opening game of the COHL semi-final in front of 500 matchhangers. As a result of the triumph they are now favourites to take what should be a thrilling best 3 out of 5 series. The second game is here this Friday night.

Playoff hockey, nonexistent in the sham series with Guelph which Raiders romped through with an 11 goal per game average, arrived in this first clash complete with 24 karat tension.

Both teams checked hard in the first period which went scoreless. In fact, the game was almost half gone when Raiders finally broke the bodily on a perfect pass play instigated by Joe Auger while Bradford had the odd man Auger stole the puck near the Raider blue line, skated to centre and found big rearguard Gord Thompson with a picture pass as he hit the Ford's blueline with nobody between himself and goalie Bill Orr. The puck hit the twine at the 8:01 mark.

Orr Hurt

That was all for the middle period which was cut short five minutes early while Orr left for repairs after a bullet like wrist shot off the stick of Fraser Dunn almost detached his right car. Dunn let the shot go from just inside the blue line and Orr only had time to throw his glove over his face. The puck felled him like a cannon charger. The remaining minutes were tacked onto the third period. Thirty nine seconds of the third were history when Evergreen Junior Beaumont scored Raiders' second goal, the winner as it turned out, from the edge of the crease. Dunn passed to Blake Inglis who let the shot go, and Beaumont tipped it into the open carrier.

SHORT SHOTS - Third game of the series is in Bradford this Sunday night and 200 tickets at that game will be on sale at the box office Friday night. Raiders were assessed 9 penalties and Bradford 7. Series A between Oakville and Toronto, a 4 out of 7 affair, is still very much in doubt. Toronto tied the series at 2 games apiece with a 3-3 win Tuesday. Boyer beat him from close in night.
