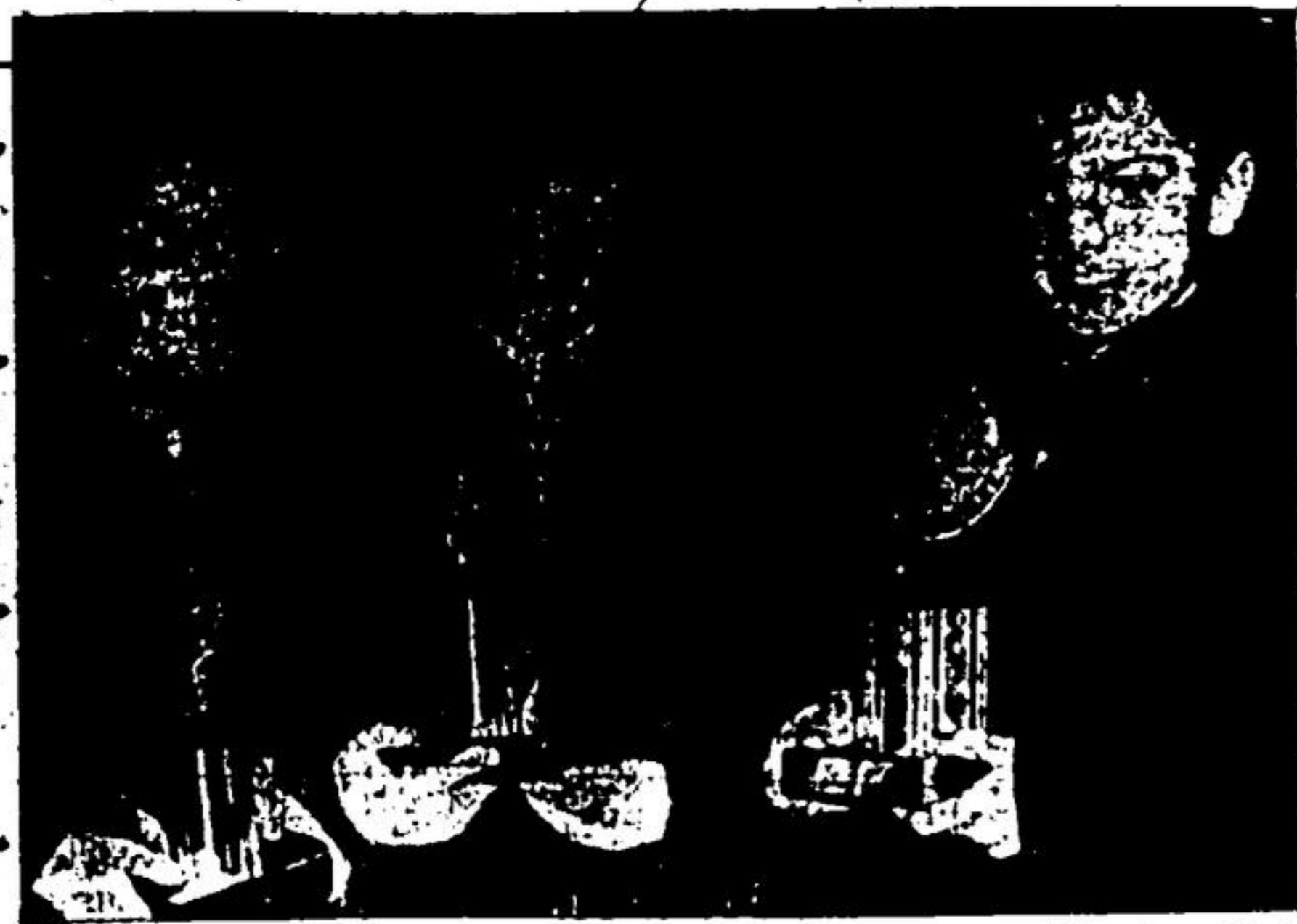


Laurels For Little Leaguers As Kid Hockey Ends Saturday



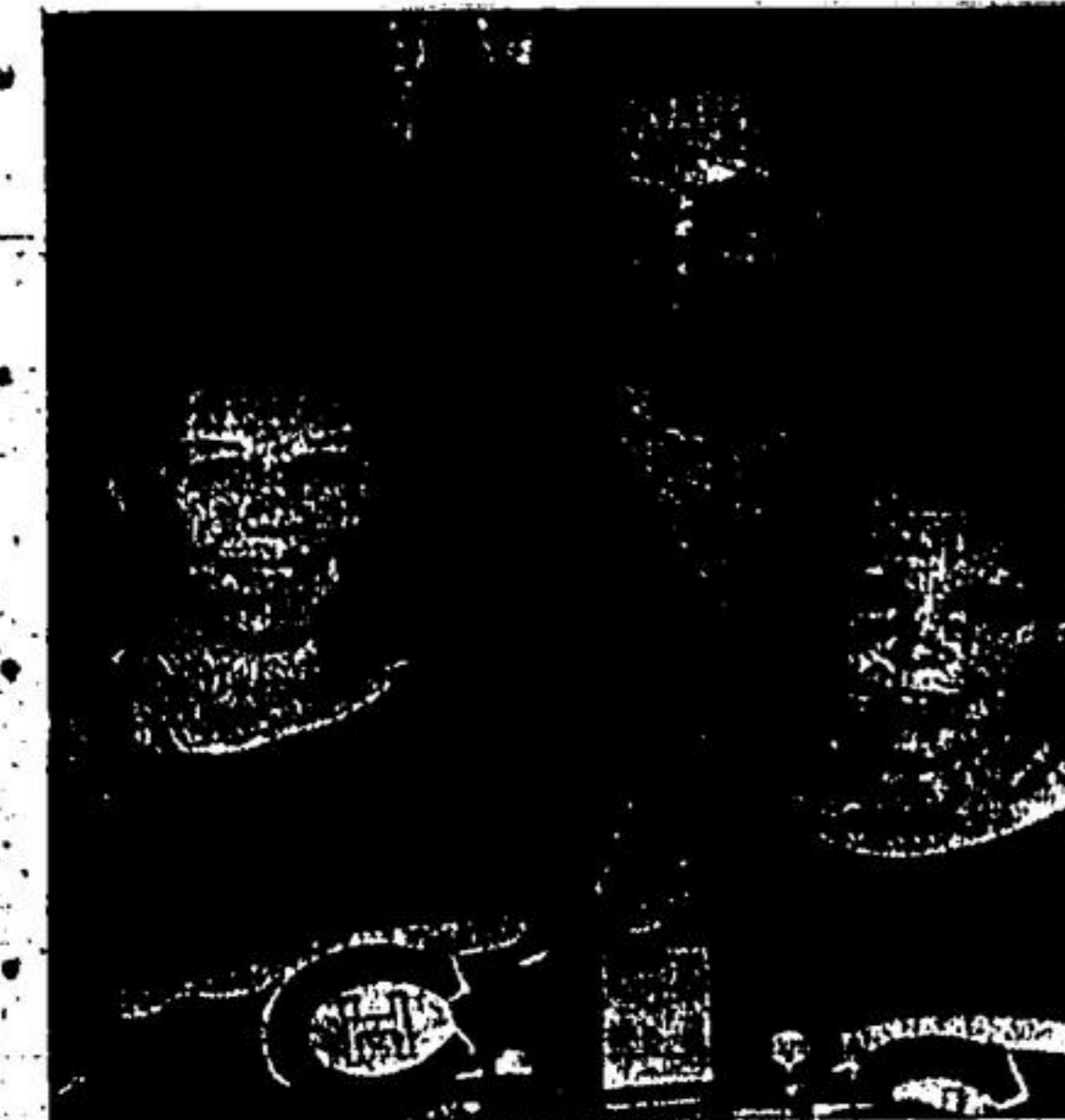

Town Novices Enter Brampton Tournament

Forty-eight teams (including Georgetown) with 1,000 hockey players between the ages of eight and ten will soon be invading Brampton for the third annual Brampton Little Marlies hockey week tournament, April 28th to 30th.

The tournament will feature 96 hours of hockey in four sections: 'A' for communities over 25,000; 'B' 7,501 to 25,000; 'C' 2,501 to 7,500; and 'D' up to 2,500. Teams from Ontario, Manitoba and the United States will be competing for championships in each division as well as a grand championship.

New additions to the tournament this year are: Niagara Falls, Detroit, Mich.; Woodbridge, Elora, New Hamburg, and Midland.

Brampton plays Port Huron, Michigan, in an international exhibition to officially open the tournament on Friday, April 28th, at 8:30 p.m. Toronto will play Stan Bradley's Winnipeg Cubs in an east-west championship on April 27th. All players are belted in.
