No Family Court Judge in Peel
Peel county has been without a family court judge for over a year and this was described as "a shocking state of affairs for a county the size of Peel" by Mrs. Katharine Carter, clerk of the court, in her annual report to county council. The vacancy arose with the resignation in 1960 of Judge Darcy Graydon.

None Available
Family court judges from other counties have heard cases here in 1961 but on at least one occasion a sitting had to be cancelled because no judge was available. The report was submitted to county council last Thursday and was referred to the legislative committee for further study. The provincial government is responsible for appointing judges to the justice and family court.

She said "Some of them are sent to full residential schools. Some type of training school is needed that will keep the children on the local track until they gain maturity. Most of the children affected are merely transient cases and inclined to petty thieving."
