



**Shoe Merchant was Former Councillor**

A former town councillor and veteran of two wars, William Frederick Smith, 60, died at his home, 22 Park Ave on Sunday, March 25th.

Mr. Smith served as a councillor under Mayor Joseph Gibbons from 1935 to 1938. He was a member of First Baptist Church, served as church treasurer for a number of years and enjoyed singing in the choir in his younger days.

He was born at Kingsthorpe, Northampton, England, came to Canada in 1912 and settled in Brampton where he worked at his trade with the Williams Shoe firm. A skilled shoemaker he was proficient in the craft of building a complete shoe himself. He stitched thousands of army boots for soldiers in the first war, in 1915 he joined the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery, training at Kingston, went overseas with the 5th Battalion and was wounded in action during the first battle of the Somme.

Invalued home, he worked on Galt & Scott's for three years on ladies' fine shoes. He returned to Brampton where he was employed with Howatson Shoe Co.

He married Margaret Nellie Heron and in 1928 they moved to Georgetown where he purchased the shoe business of W. C. Bartlett which he operated for 17 years. When the second war broke out he enrolled with the Veterans Guild of Canada, and was later transferred to the army medical corps, serving as a corporal until the war ended. His wife managed the business during his time.

In 1945 the shoe business was sold to Ross Thompson, who later sold to Maher Shoes, Mr. and Mrs. Smith purchased the Walter Parson property on Park Ave and had resided there since.
