

Council Briefs

Among business items on council's Monday agenda, action was taken for:

- Proclaim Easter Week as bantam hockey week in Georgetown.
- Assess the Cemetery Board a \$25 yearly fee for water, in line with a new policy of charging water costs to all local boards.
- Allow the hospital auxiliary to hold tag days June 1-3 and on fall fair days.
- Check on waste paper which Clarence Collins claims hinders the shopping plaza and the highway and obviate efforts to keep the town's highway approach neat.
- Have a new ball diamond ready in the park for an active season of baseball outlined to council by Bill Smith and Bill Richmond. The latter offered to supply pipe for a protective fence behind the backstop.
- Deal with a proposed contract submitted by the police association for negotiation.
- Consider a proposal of Cr. Harrison that a start be made on lighting for the baseball diamonds by at least installing poles this year.
- Endorse preparation of a new water rate by-law.
- Print 200 copies of the auditor's report, for which three bids will be asked from printers.

James Street Site For Ambulance Garage

A new ambulance garage may be built on James Street if the town can secure a suitable bid from a local contractor. Council on Monday authorized invited bids to be submitted by April 26th from a number of local firms. At Cr. Harrison's suggestion, bids will be sealed and will be opened at a council meeting.

The town owns two parcels of land on James Street and council will later decide on the location for the much-needed ambulance building. Since the volunteer ambulance service was established five years ago, it has used the former hydro garage on Cross Street.

EASTER HOURS AT POST OFFICE

Georgetown post office will be open for two hours only on Good Friday, from 8:00 until 10:00 a.m. There will be no letter carrier or rural route delivery, and no financial business transacted on that day.

On Easter Monday the post office will be open four hours, from 8 to 12 noon, for all types of business. Firms wishing mail registered or any other personal transaction must be at the post office before noon. There will be carrier and rural route delivery as usual, and mail dispatches will be normal.

Resident Found Dead In Town Parking Lot

A former Provincial Paper mill employee, John Allan "Jack" Dempster, 35 Main St. N. was found dead in the downtown public parking lot near his apartment early Saturday morning by PC Mike Christopher while making his rounds.

An autopsy conducted by Brampton pathologist, Dr. Longfield, revealed exposure and heart trouble contributed to his death. The body was found face down directly behind a cement block garage at about 5:30 and had been lying there for an undetermined length of time. But death was attributed completely to natural causes.

A native of Belfast, Ireland, he came to Canada in September of 1923 and had worked at Provincial from 1940 to until October 1961. He was unemployed at the time of his death. He leaves one brother, Hugh now living in western Canada.
