Clarify Authority In Municipal Jobs

A number of motions were adopted on Monday by council designed to clarify areas of administrative authority.

- Alfred Collins was appointed general foreman, and the chain of authority in the public works department was detailed at superintendent works G. R. Bligh, general foreman Collins and foreman George Rowe.
- Frank Whitnee, who has been water meter reader, will now be known as water inspector.
- Continuance of a \$75 yearly car allowance was okayed for Cliff Hibbert, the assistant assessor.
- Mr. Whitnee's new appointment will give him authority to check and enforce provisions of the water by law, according to Deputy Reeve Hunter.
- Mr. Hunter said he thinks there are several water users at present not paying proper rates, and the inspector will be better equipped to deal with by law provisions.
