## Milton Lady Attends Reading Conference

The Seventh Annual Conference of the International Reading Association was held in San Francisco May 2nd to 5th with 3550 delegates attending. The International Reading Association was formed in 1954 to promote the best methods of teaching reading, a science which must be used in all forms of learning and to make these methods available internationally.

Canada has 58 Councils, USA 202, Australia 8 and England 2. Sweden and Finland have requested they be established there. The aim of the Association is to help stamp out world illiteracy. Halton Council established in 1956 has 220 members and hopes to double this. Mrs. Eda Press, Milton, President of the Council 1962-63 attended the San Francisco Conference as Halton delegate.

Theme of the conference was Challenge and Experiment in Reading.

The first day could be spent observing in the San Francisco schools or attending special classes dealing with various reading problems. In the evening a business meeting was held and the new executive introduced.

The second day began with a civic welcome at the beautiful Civic Auditorium. Dr. Durrell of Boston University gave a stirring address on the Need of Dedicated Teachers. The delegates then broke into groups to attend various section meetings in phonics, reading instruction, diagnosis, new procedures, etc. These were held in the morning and afternoon. In the evening a reception for the delegates was held in the Gold Ballroom of the Sheraton Palace.

The last day of the convention was demonstrations of different techniques to improve reading, controversial techniques, research reports, etc. These were held in the afternoon at which Doris Gates well known author of children's books was guest speaker. A general session followed this to close the conference.

Next year the conference will be held in Miami, Florida.

## Ratepayer Disagrees With Policy on Dogs

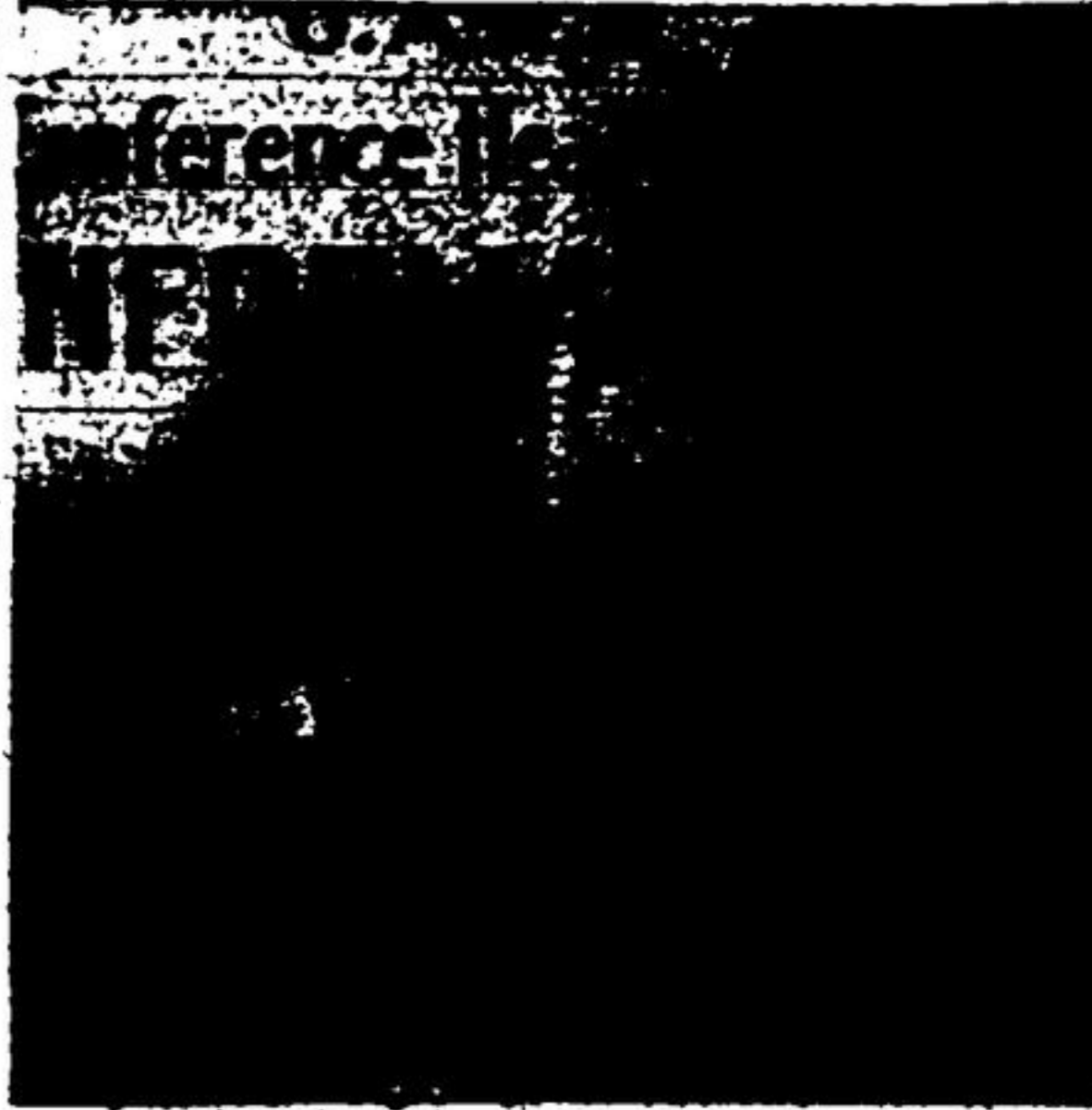
"Even human beings kick up their heels sometimes" remarked Robert Letta as he complained to council last week that the dog controller had tried to entice his dog into the central wagon.
