

All age groups should receive this Vaccine whether or not they have been prevlously immunized with Salk Vaccine. Maximum immunity is obtained by the use of Salk Vaccine and the new Vaccine, and it is hoped that poliomyelitis can be eliminated entirely by the effective use of these two immunizing agents.
