Remind Quarries of By-Law Regulations

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" seems to be the motto of Esqueping Township Council. To forestall any possible trouble they decided to send copies of the Quarries by-law to all the large stone crushing quarries in the township.

"While I don't think anyone is violating the by-law," said Councillor Walter Linham, "by notifying them first we make sure." "Blasting can cause the most complaints," opined Councillor G. Currie.

It was felt the green belt requirement around the quarry was not clearly understood by the quarry owners.

Decries Interest Lag In Ratepayer Group

Dear Sir:

In writing this letter I have been wondering as I lay in bed, what do the ratepayers of Georgetown want? I mean do they want a ratepayers association or don't they?

When my wife visited me on Wednesday afternoon and told me that there were only about 10 people at the meeting in the council offices on Tuesday night, I really felt disgusted, for included in the 10 were 4 ratepayers from Brampton, one of whom was guest speaker. That man was Mr. Ken Mathers, president of Brampton (Northwood) Ratepayers Association, and to my knowledge he had quite a speech prepared. I'm glad to say that Mr. Mathers got his information he possessed about ratepayers over to the press representatives that were at the meeting. The first ratepayers association I was in (Delreux) lots of people wouldn't join because they thought it was all one sided. We had approximately 120 members then we changed the name to Georgetown East, we got approx. 90 members that year. This year we have changed it to have it open to the whole of Georgetown, but the response in my opinion is disheartening. I doubt if we have over 35 members. Lots of people say "what do we need an association for anyway?" Well the answer to that is that the association acts as a watchdog over your affairs and if you are members, and have a complaint you bring it to the association who in turn take it to the council.

An association is only as strong as you, the ratepayers want it. I myself when I called it the Georgetown Ratepayers Association was hoping that by this time we would have over 150 members... well, I was wrong, and believe me there are lots of people who are tickled to death at the poor turnout of the meetings, well the next one I believe will be on the third Tuesday in June in the council chambers and I ask you the ratepayers not to let the association down. If you can't make the meetings, still please join! Membership is only \$1.00 per year.

Before closing I would like to find out if the association can have two volunteers with a truck or trailer to pick up 10 8' x 3 1/2' folding tables at the Delreux Building between 8:00-8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and drop them off at my place, 13 Baylawn Cr. TL 7-4373.

I made arrangements once to pick up these same tables at 7 p.m. but the general manager of Delreux Developments had left word that they could only be picked up during the office hours. Well I can't do it during those hours, so I hope someone can, as we have to sell those tables, some are already sold.

At the time of writing, I've no idea how long I shall be here in hospital, but hope it won't be too long.

Thanks again for the space I've taken in your paper. I only hope that we get the membership as right now we most certainly need an association.
