County Planning Role Topic for Workshop

The "Role of the County in Planning" is the topic for the Third in the series of Regional Planning Workshops being conducted in Georgetown.

Warden Wilfrid Bird will be chairman for the discussion in Wrighleysworth School, Thursday, May 24th (tonight) starting at 8:30 p.m.

Guest speakers are Mr. J. R. Sims, former reeve of Watford, Past President, Association of Ontario Counties and Past-Warden, Wentworth County; and Mr. Delby Bucknall, reeve, Clinton Township, Past Warden, Lincoln County and President of the Association of Ontario Counties.

Point Out Drawbacks
Representatives of 18 municipalities subject to Metropolitan pressures will attend the Workshop. It is designed as a forum for the pointing out of the drawbacks to planning on a Municipal level and to direct thinking toward regional planning.

"The Association of Ontario Counties is promoting the role of the County as a more effective planning basis," Workshop Chairman, Alex MacLaren, reports.

"It is generally agreed, however, that the county as presently constituted, cannot achieve more than is being accomplished at the municipal level because of lack of co-operation between Rural and Urban municipalities and financial limitations."

Only Solution
In the first Planning Workshop, March 22nd, representatives agreed that planning on a regional basis was the only solution to the planning problem. They concluded, however, that present legislation is inadequate and the Provincial Government unsympathetic.

On Thursday, April 26th, farmers took over the Workshop session. They were critical of Planning Boards in general and professional planners in particular for dictatorial attitudes towards Municipal planning.

Another Workshop is planned for June 14th. It will be followed by a banquet on June 28th.
