WEED KILLERS

There has been a steady; improvement in chemical weed killers for lawns since 2-4-D and other killers first appeared on the market like the flies with DDT, some weeds or more likely new and hardier strains of weeds, seem to have developed an Immunity to the first sprays so scientists have been working on stronger and more specialized killers The trick is to get something that will kill the weeds but let the grass survive or other plants

For the average lawn and lawn owner, of course, a general purpose 2-4-D spray will still prove satisfactory It will get some of the com-
