

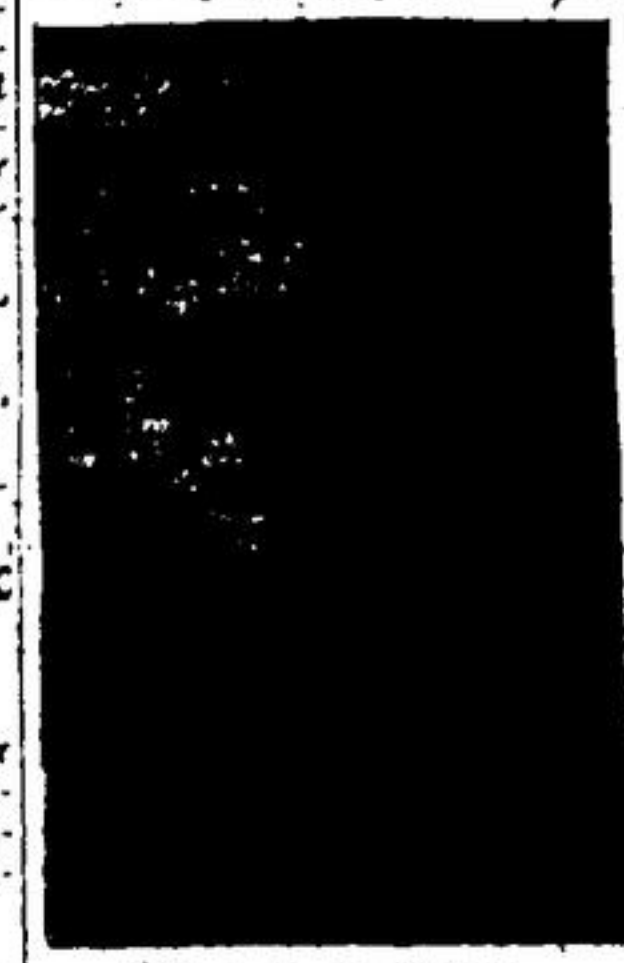
Local Plant Eighth in Marietta Firm Divisions

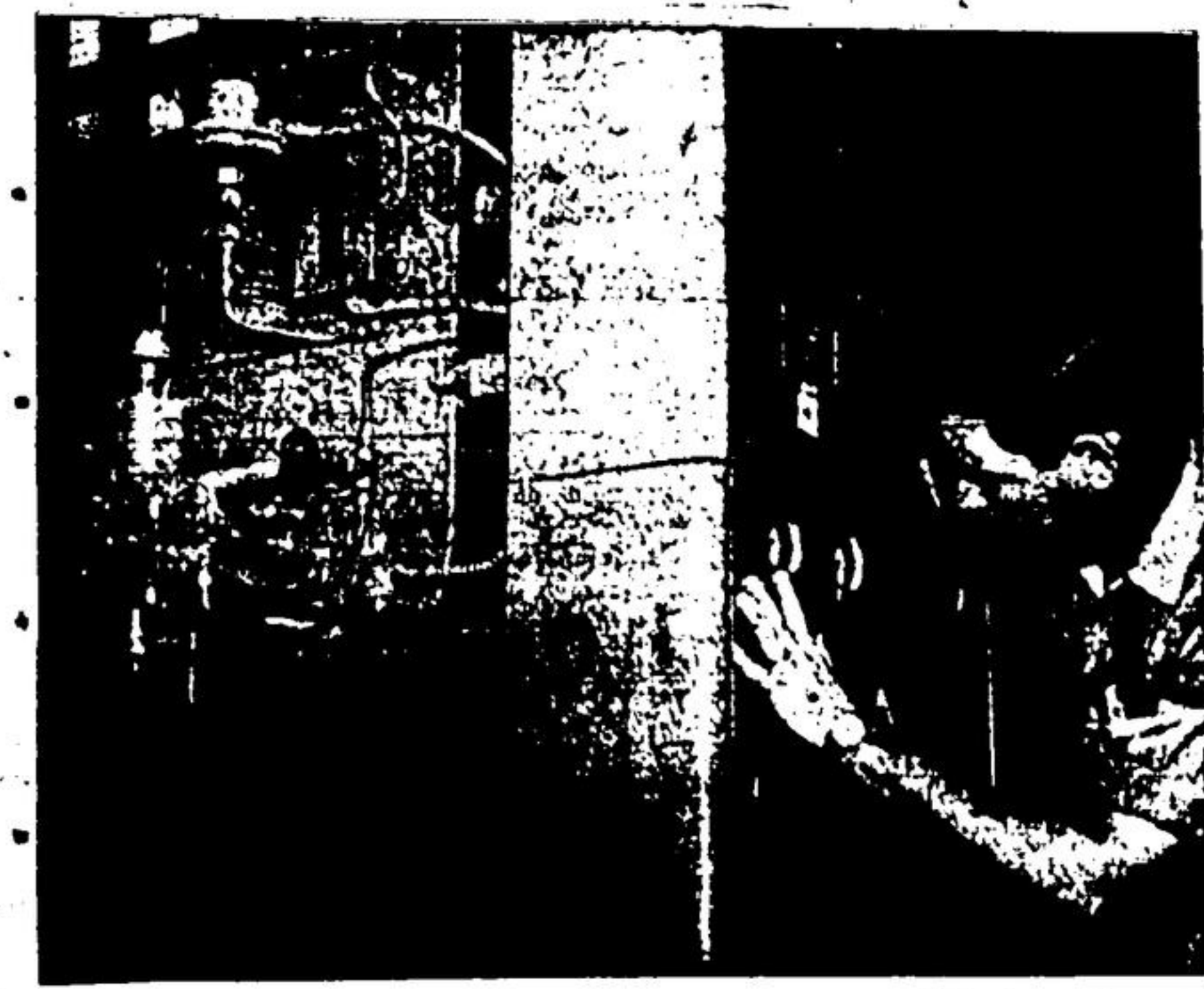
Cry "Foul"

Three Thornhill Firsts For Young Horsewoman

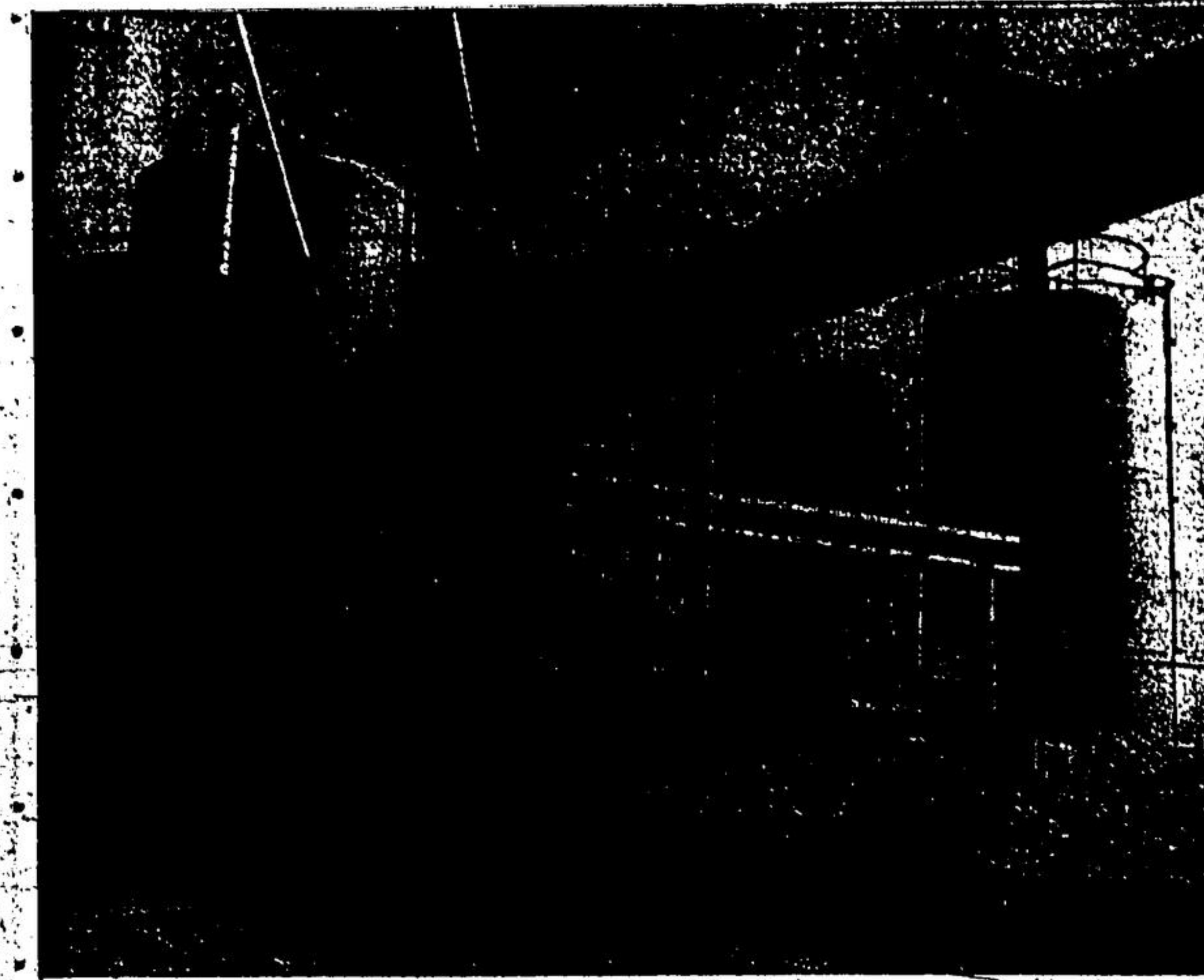
A local girl, Wendy Marks, had an outstanding day at Thornhill Horse Show on Sunday when she entered seven events and emerged with seven ribbons.
