Procedural By-Law Mooted For Council

A procedural by-law which did not find favour with the 1961 council may be adopted this year. A short discussion came up at Monday's council meeting when a majority of councillors wanted a system of passing by-laws at one single session. A by-law must have three readings to become law. The matter came up during a routine by-law which delays this week is a waste of time. "Not at all" opined Cr. Em. Armstrong, Todd and Sinclair. "Council should have a week to think over any by-law and that's what we would have if we followed procedure." Deputy Reeve Hunter urged the split procedure be followed. "Good idea" he said as it has been in several other by-laws this year. "Petty politics" charged Cr. Bob McNeilly, "it's time coming procedure council is not in itself good to business. To a position to make such rules."

Plan Sub Post Office

When post office and customs office facilities are moved from Mill St. to Maple Ave. the downtown area won't be left high and dry. An announcement from the department of public works this week states that a sub post office will be located on Main St. to serve this area. Exact location of the sub post office is not known and an announcement won't be made until the new federal building is ready for occupancy.

May Include Unemployment Office

The proposed main building on Maple Ave. will be a one storey structure to be erected on the southwest corner of Guelph and Maple Ave. West. It may be occupied by a branch of the Unemployment Insurance Commission as well as the Post Office and Customs and Excise Division of the Department of National Revenue. A contract for \$175,000 was awarded to Wilchar Construction Limited of Dundas.
