Georgetown Girl Killed Three Seriously Injured

A young girl lost her life and three passengers in the car were seriously injured in a car accident which occurred on the 8th line, above the Check Line, on Saturday afternoon about 1:30 p.m.

Ann Simpson, 16 year old daughter of Mr. Norman Simpson of Georgetown, was instantly killed when she lost control of the car she was driving and hit the bridge abutment near the entrance to Reesey's gravel pit.

Roy Johnson, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Johnson, who lives on the 8th line above the scene of the accident, Clifford and Kenneth Wease, 5 and 8 year old sons of Mr. and Mrs. Orval Wease of R.R. 1, Glen Williams and grandsons of Mr. and Mrs. Johnson, were passengers in the car. They were taken by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. Later Saturday, Roy was removed to Toronto General Hospital and on Sunday Clifford was taken to the Sick Children's Hospital in Toronto. The car, owned by Mr. Simpson, was completely destroyed.
