and Georgetown is the other. The Regional Director pointed out that there is a fee for their services, but if the patlent cannot pay, or can only pay a portion, the fee is changed or waived altogether. "No case is refused," she emphasized. "We are on call 24 hours a day."

Administration and management is controlled by a local board of management who are responsible for relaing and administering funds. The money is usually raised through campalent, feet, and municipal grants. Approximately 38% of the expenses are covered by fees and 45% from campaigns.
