Has Heart Attack Dies in Automobile

First param of the scene of a fatal accident on the 4th Line on Saturday, Jack McDougall died later that day from a heart attack.

Mr. McDougall, a shovel operator in a gravel pit nearby on the James McBride farm, heard the crash and ran to the scene, then ran to phone for help. A young Georgetown girl, Anne Simpson, 14, was killed and three others badly injured in the crash.

Mr. McDougall, who worked for Johnson Brothers at the pit, had been boarding in town at the home of Mrs. C. Sargent, 71 Charles St. He complained that he did not feel well shortly before the accident. Later in the afternoon he was driving to his home in Mount Forest with his son Jim and suffered a fatal seizure in the car.

He leaves his wife, seven sons and one daughter. He was a cousin of Mrs. Jack Withamson of town.
