Shut-Offs Coming
Warn Delinquents

Still threatening water shut-offs for those who owe water bills, Deputy Reeve Wm. F. Hunter expressed surprise that many of the 240 delinquents have not responded to newspaper advertising and registered letters.

Mr. Hunter told council on Monday that letters had been sent last Friday warning of shut-offs unless payment arrangements were made within seven days.

"That's this Friday and we are going to be forced to take action against those we don't hear from," he warned.
