Appoint Ballinafad Man Halton Museum Curator

Major Harold J. (Hal) Newman of Georgetown was last week chosen curator of the new Halton County Museum at the Duff Alexander farm near Milton Heights. Working under the direction of the Halton County Museum Association board he began his duties there last week.

The curator has many excellent ideas for making the Museum a Halton landmark, and is currently drawing up plan of development stretching over the next five years to have the completion of the museum coincide with the centennial of Canada.

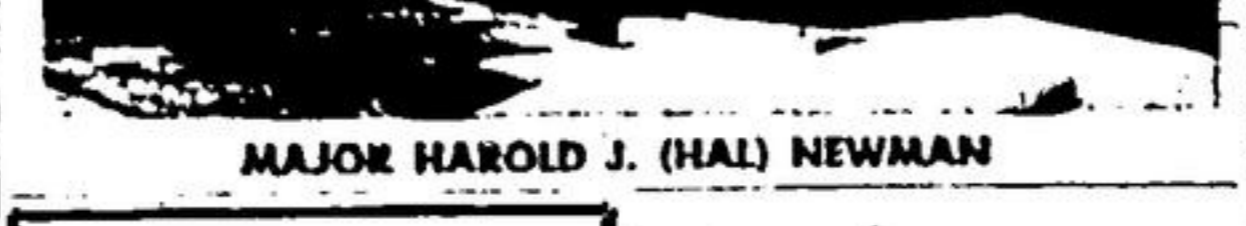
An accomplished painter, he has taught art classes in Milton, Guelph, Acton and Bolton for several years. He served in World War One, then entered Sandhurst Military Academy in England. He still is on reserve call in the British Army. He later graduated from McGill University with an M.A. and from Cambridge with an M.A. and Ph.D. in history and philosophy.

He was once associated with York Museum, where he assisted with the research into Canada's military history and worked on drawings for the displays. He is dominion secretary of the United Empire Loyalists Association, and has a list of UELAs who came to New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Ontario from New York and Pennsylvania.

Painting Halton: Maj. Newman has just completed an art show in Burlington, where he exhibited 64 pictures. A current project he hopes to finish by next fall is a series of 100 paintings depicting some of the finer settlements in Halton County.

The curator has tackled the gigantic task of assembling a museum with a fervor. He's brimming over with ideas for making the museum a real showplace of Halton's early days, and he claims that many of his ideas can be put into operation without too much cost.
