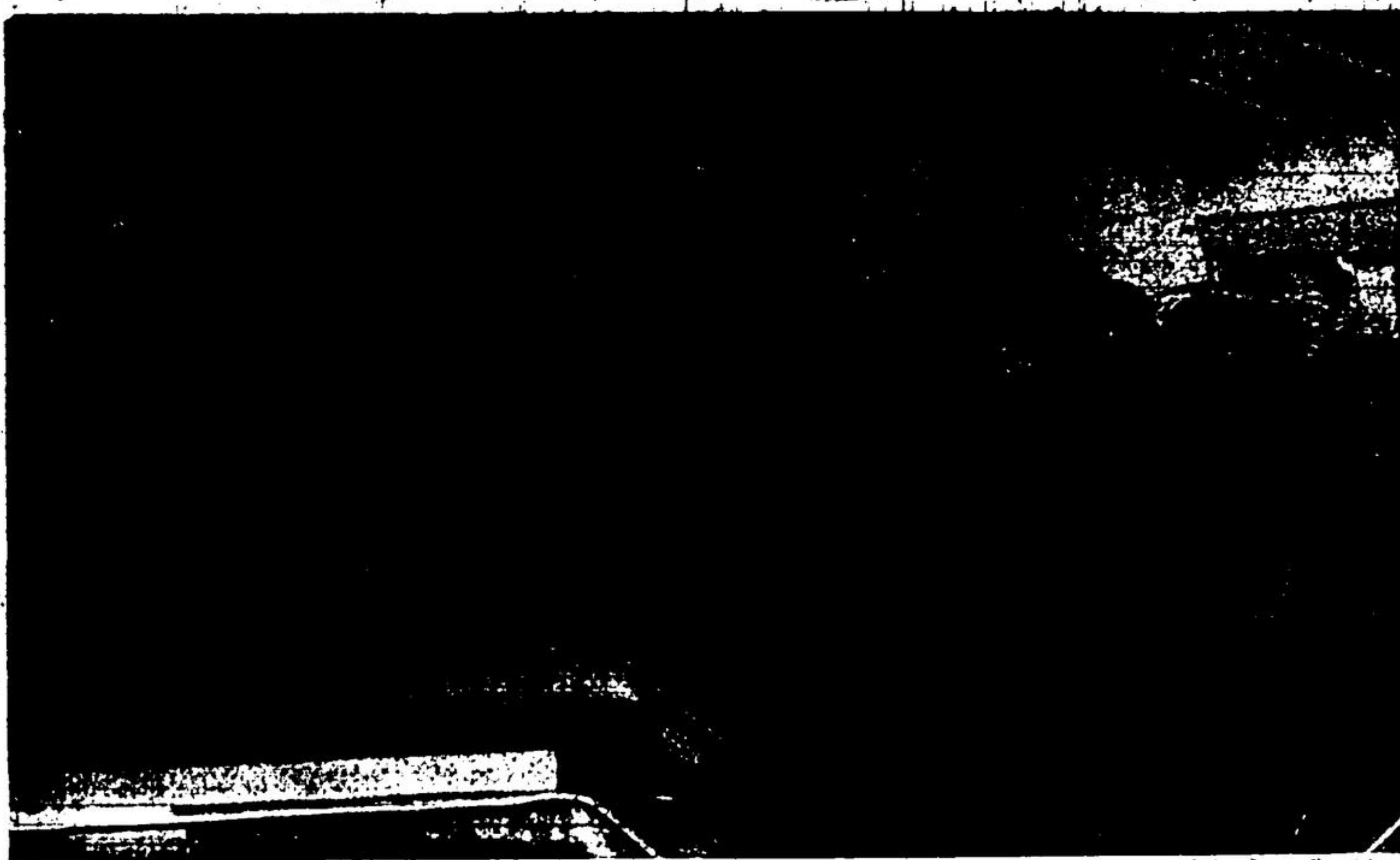

No Persecution Police Chief Says

"Not true," said a letter from police chief Roy Haley read to council last week by police chairman Don Barrager in reply to charges by Mike Marko that the local police had begun persecuting him and his shop.

Mr. Marko had asked that council study charges which had been laid against him and Mr. Barrager's report recalled any court cases since 1955.

His report listed a \$14 speeding fine in 1956; a careless driving dismissed in 1957; a \$5 parking fine in 1958; a \$10 speeding fine in 1960 and a charge dismissed for removing a road barrier, and in 1962 a dismissal in a collision charge, an \$8 fine for not having a licence plate light and a \$10 speeding fine.

The chief's letter said charges had all been laid in the line of duty and there is no evidence of persecution by his force.
