Truck Becomes Flaming Barbecue In Seventh Line Chase, Monday

A mobile barbecue gave motorists on the 7th Line between Ashgrove and Stewartown a start Monday. Drivers were agog at the sight of a truck loaded with charcoal rolling along the paved road nonchalantly with a fiery trail, and smoke pouring from the cargo of new charcoal. The flaming vehicle was finally halted near Ashgrove by a motorist who had chased it attempting to draw the driver's attention to his predicament, all the way from above Stewartown. Firemen were called and shovelled the burning charcoal into the ditch. The unburned charcoal was picked up later by another truck from the firm that was transporting it, Scarborough Fuels, which is operated by Cornelius Bestmeyer. Fire Chief Bob Bonfield said the truck was loaded with hot charcoal near here and when fanned by the wind once the truck got moving, ignited a number of paper bags in the back. The platform was damaged by the flames and the back window of the cab was blown out by the heat. A couple of grass fires along the side of the road resulted from burning paper and charcoal flying off the truck.
