

Says Georgetown, Acton Polluting Credit River

Peel Council Asks OWRC Investigate

Peel County Council has asked the Ontario Water Resources Commission to conduct an immediate investigation of evidence of pollution from industries upstream at Georgetown and Acton.

Condemning the fact that pollution of the river "caused it to be of little value for recreation purposes by the residents of Peel County" the council of the County of Peel asked that the Credit Valley Conservation Authority be notified of the action taken.

Levied Fines
The resolution calling for action to halt river pollution was presented to county council by Deputy Reeve George Gard, house of Chinguacousy and C. M. "Chic" Murray, Deputy Reeve of Toronto Township. In a brief session that industries could be fined \$50 per day for polluting plants.

Low Water
One reason given for the present high degree of pollution is the low water level of the Credit River. The Toronto Township council has not permitted swimming stations to decrease pollution of the Credit River at Erindale rivers and streams. He also said for several years because of the Ontario Water Resources Commission has, in many cases, demanded prompt improvements in industrial disposal methods and levied a \$50 per day fine against offending manufacturing plants.

Propose Hotel - Motel For Highway Junction

Approval was given for a proposed sizable hotel-motel at the junctions of Highways 10 and 7 by Chinguacousy Township Council Monday night. The building inspector was authorized to issue a permit if the building meets township specifications and standards.

Tentative sketches of the hotel-motel were sent to Council by Norman House of Cheltenham who said he wanted Council's approval before asking the architect to draw formal plans.

"Shouldn't this go before the planning board?" asked Councillor Frank Lyons.

"It doesn't need to," replied Reeve Cyril Clark, "this is council business."

To be located on the southwest corner of the junction, the hotel-motel would replace a restaurant, gas station and two small industries. These would relocate elsewhere in the township.

"It wouldn't be possible to have a hotel there," said Deputy Reeve George Gardhouse, "because of sewage and water services."

"Yes, it would," replied the Reeve. "They would drill their own well and use septic tanks."

The resolution to approve construction of the hotel-motel was brought in by Councillor Ed Blair and seconded by Councillor Ron Weir.
