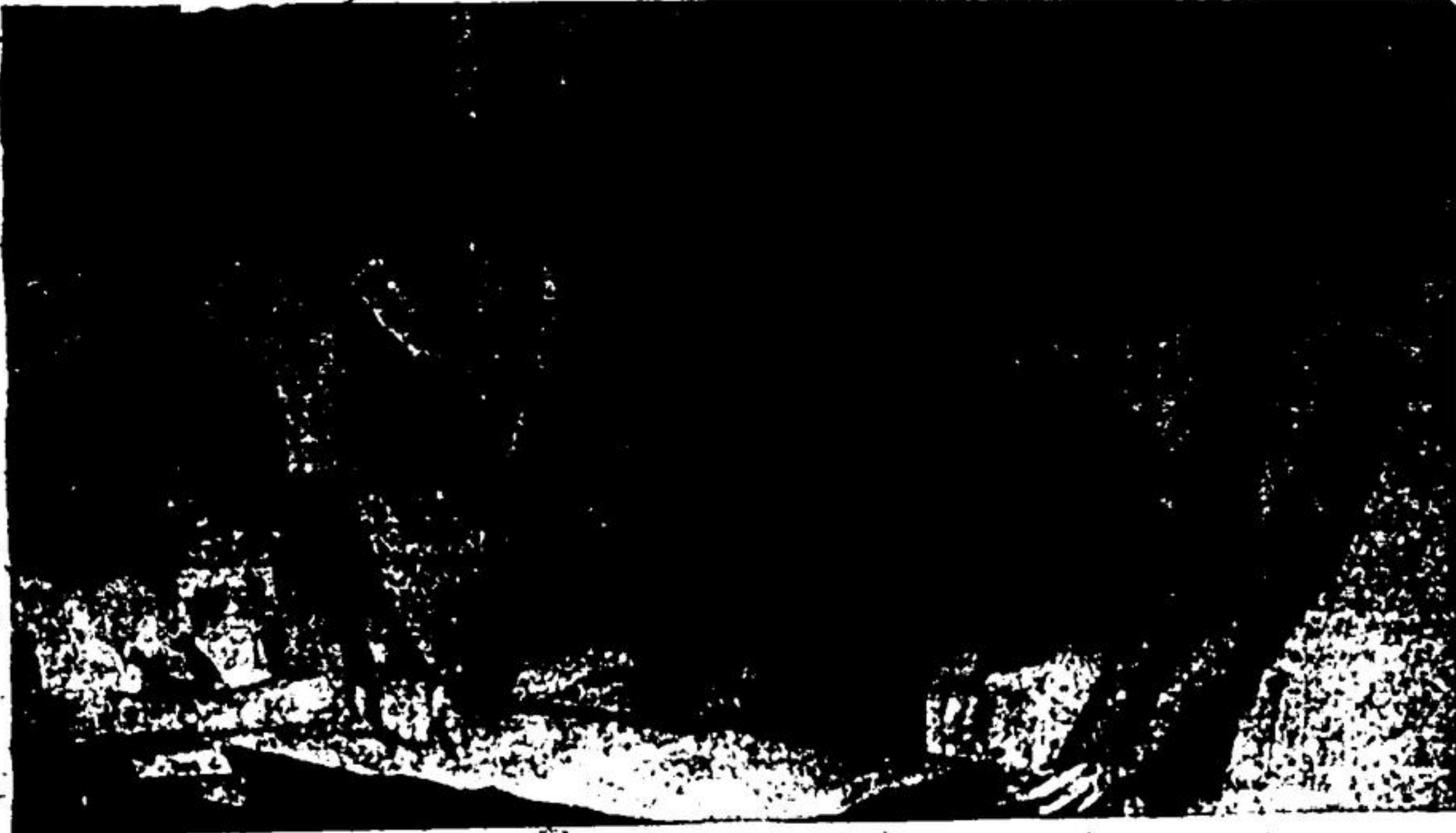


NEWFOUNDLANDERS MAKE NEW LIFE HERE

"Wabana," translated from the Indian, it means "the place where the light shines first." Unfortunately, at the moment the light is becoming a little dimmer for these hardy Bell Islanders.

Despite the break with the close knit families of a small isolated community, cut off all winter except by plane, these new citizens of Georgetown are a happy effervescent group.

Most of the men have been here from two to four months, but the women and children have arrived only in the last three or four weeks.

There's Michael Flynn, his wife Aileen and six children. He is working "on the surface" after twenty years underground in a mine. "Now I'm out, I'd never go back," he says happily. Mr. Flynn, along with other Bell Islanders, works at P. Graham Bell here in town.

The mines in Bell Island are under the sea of Conception Bay. To descend the one mine remaining in operation, the miner does his commuting down a three and a half mile slope by train, then the mine extends two and a half miles in each direction. "Don't you ever think that the sea might come crashing through" your reporter asked. "If you think of that, you wouldn't be here," replied Mr. Flynn smiling.

For many of the men this is their first job above ground. Contrary to popular belief, miners are not pale and haggard. They are hale, hearty and healthy. Financially, it will take these men a long time to attain their former earnings. Miners are well paid, and deservedly so, and in addition most of these men had no mortgage or rent to pay since they built their own homes however, they are not at all downhearted and seem very happy with their lives here.

While our ancestors on their pioneering trek used the covered wagon, these modern day pioneers in their westward trek used the plane. With the closing of all but one of the mines, the Federal Government declared Bell Island a Labour Surplus Area. Under this scheme the government will pay the transportation costs of family and furniture provided the husband has gone ahead and found a job and a home.

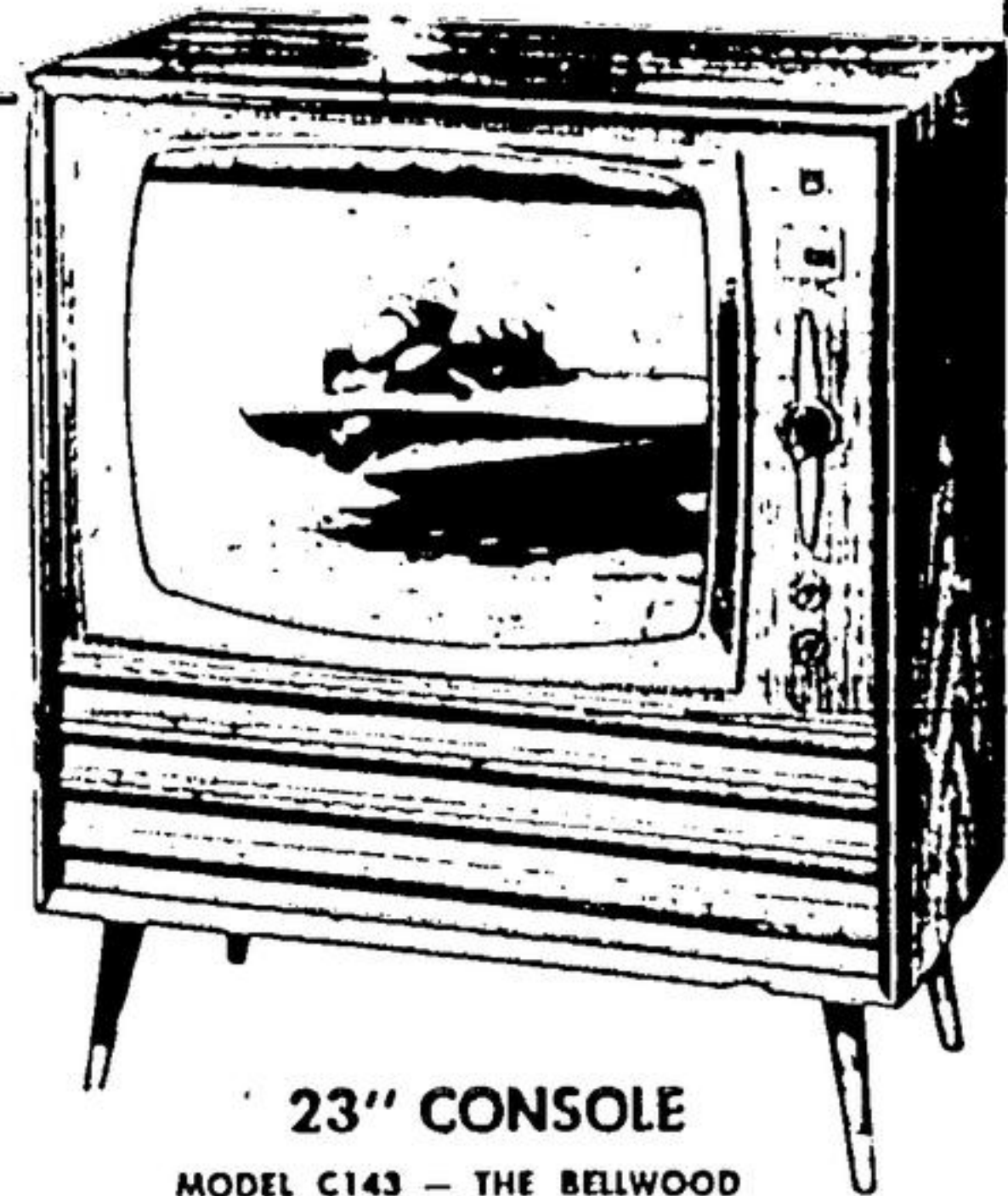

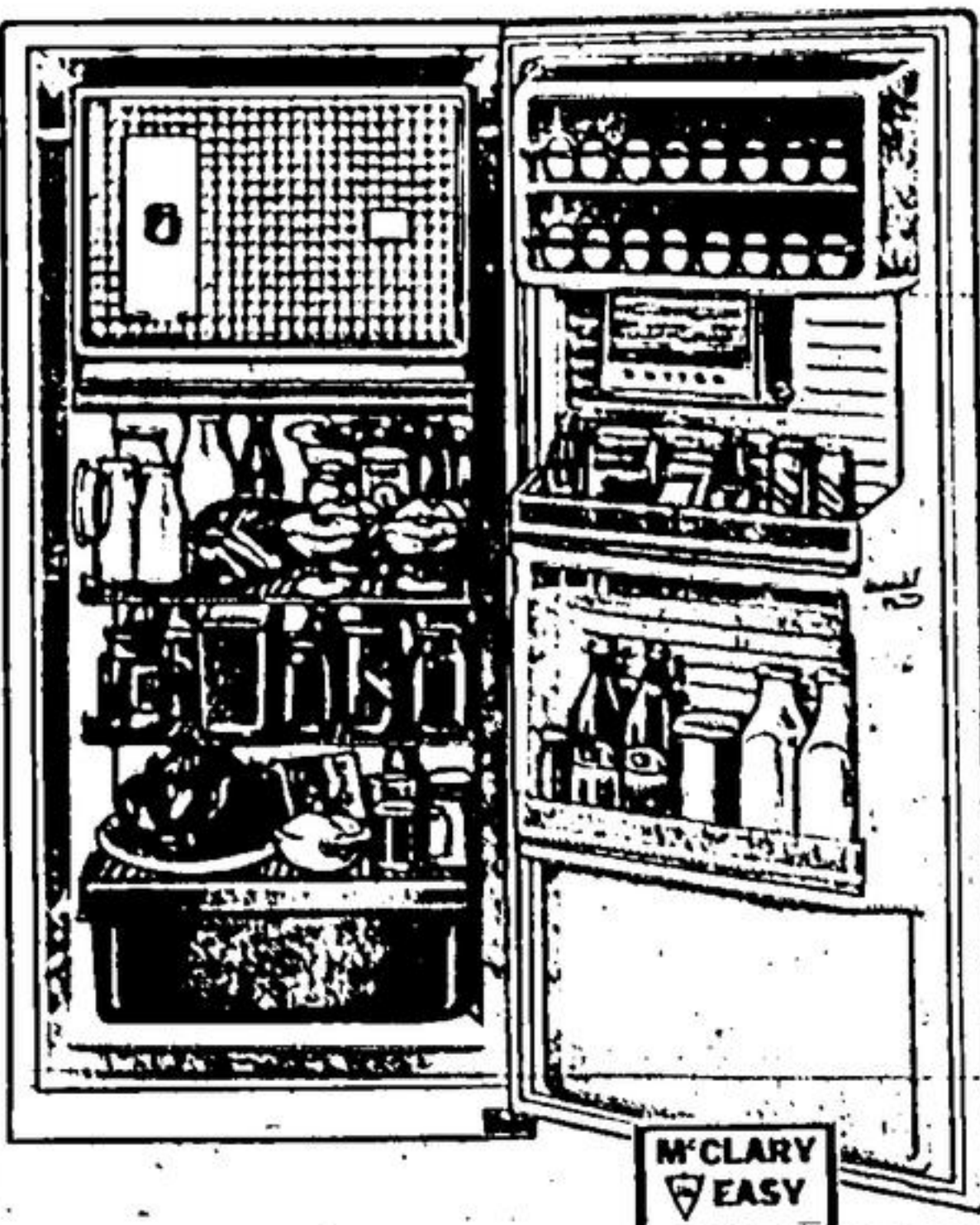

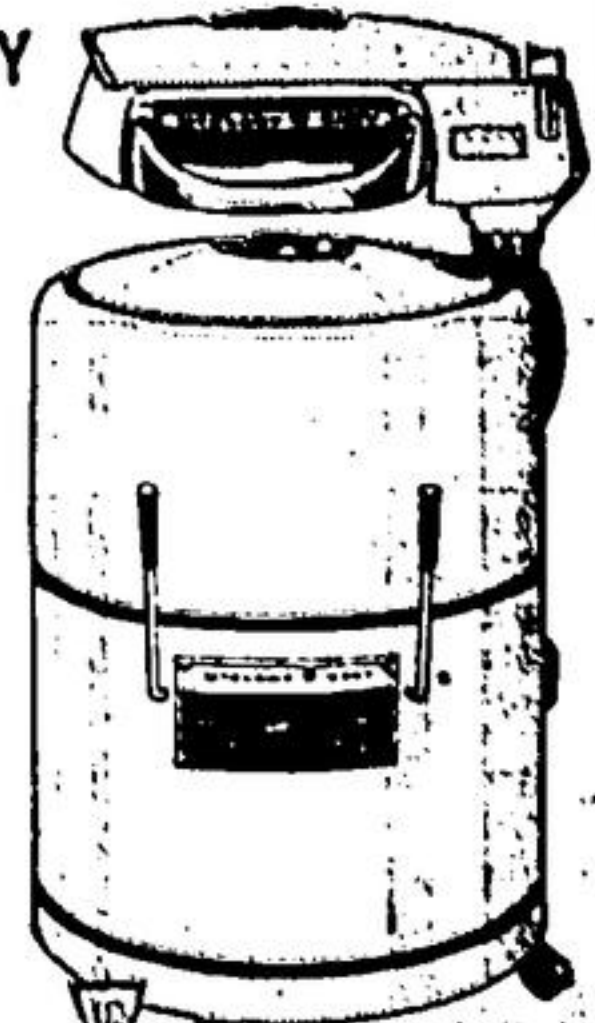
