### By-Law Governs Property Hazards

A by-law is being prepared which will impose penalties on property owners convicted of maintaining hazards on private property.

The by-law, which will be introduced at a future council meeting, is designed to force contractors and sub-contractors, particularly, to safeguard excavations and water hazards created when roads are built. Cr. Eastman said at Monday's council meeting. Recently there have been several such complaints and council's hands are tied without a regulating by-law.
