## New Stamp Marks Highway Opening

The Hon. Ellen L. Earrolough. Postmaster General, today an nounced that the postage stamp marking the opening of the Trans-Canada Highway will be released for sale on August 31. and not an September 4th, as previously announced.

Mrs. Fairclough explained that the date of release has been advanced because of the change of date for the official opening of the Highway to September 3rd. The opening, to take place at Rogers Pass to Glacier National Park, British Columbia, had originally been

planned for the 4th and the stamp was to have been issed on that date to coincide with the opening. Since post offices are closed on Labour Day, the day for the release for the stamp has been advanced to August

The Postmaster General staed that in view of the short notice given for the change in release date, all 'first day covers' received by the Postmaster, Ottawa, before September 4th, will be processed.
