Hog Cholera Hampers Swine Shows

Halton's hop producers will probably be prevented from exhibiting their swine at Georgetown's Fell Fair this. year, according to a local Department of Agriculture official.

The Health of Animals Division of the Department of Agriculture recently imposed a ban on the showing of swine at fairs and exhib-Itions in an effort to prevent the spread of hop cholers, a

major problem at present. The ban will not be lifted until the spread of the disease is definitely -checked. It will affect the C.N.E. and possibly the Royal Winter Fair.

Thus far, 15,118 hogs have been destroyed on 66 infected premises in Ontario and Quebec. Compensation has reached_\$462,932.


