tion "premature and ill-advised" until a complete legal report is received this week. Council members Bligh and Rowe voted against the motion without comment.
Rowe Elliott thought otherwise.

Setting Yaws
"It is costing the town \$240 a week for suspensions with pay. The motion is quite in order," he said, calling for a recorded vote.
Deputy Wawa Hunter said he had claimed yaws before last week's meeting that the town is overstaffed and that if the dismissal takes place he would not favour making a replacement.
A similar motion to dismiss works superintendent Bligh was then made by Zimmerman and Elliott.
Mr. Zimmerman said he was making this on the grounds that time cards had not been properly checked.
