Charles (Chuck) Laws Was 'Hasty P' Veteran

Charles Laws, died suddenly at his home, 45 Churchill Crescent, on Saturday, August 25th, at the age of thirty-nine. Mr. Laws who was born and educated in Georgetown was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Fred Laws. He was a veteran of the second world war having served with the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment.
At the time of his death Mr. Laws was on the committee of the Six Georgetown Scouts and a former member of the Georgetown Fire Department, and the Royal Canadian Legion. He was employed at Smith and Stone Limited.

Mr. Laws leaves his wife, the former Marjorie Harlow and their two children Patricia and Reg. A brother and two sisters Vic Tedder of Port Credit, V. (Mrs. George) Maradea of Brampton and Mar (Mrs. Agnes) Grest of Georgetown also survive.

John Havelock (page 1) as a ratee to him at head charged all election candidates this year to take a stand for or against that.


"If they do, I predict you'll find those who favour it setting on council next year," he observed.
Later a Cuck - McNulty motion to have deputations without written material beforehand and to speak only other other business was dealt with at council meetings was held down 7-2.

Cr. Cuck said he was disappointed with something which is time consuming and "crucifying our laws."
It appears to be for political gain, he charged, with disregard for the welfare of Georgetown. He appealed for representatives and councilmen to unite and "get Georgetown out to front" and pointed to this week's industrial exhibition as one way of promoting good publicity.

Other councillors, some of whom expressed sympathetic views, would not favour the motion, saying it is a ratepayer's right to state his views to council.

Mayor Sargent said some towns follow the suggested procedure but a change at this time could be unconstructive. He thinks council should investigate a procedure by law before taking any such measures.
