Estimate 31,000 For Halton School Enrolment

School doors across Halton County reopened Tuesday morning after a long summer holiday, and an estimated 31,000 students marched right in and took a seat. This means that over one-quarter of the County's 115,000 population is in school this week.

Approximate figures on the enrolment for this term show Burlington leading with 12,500, Oakville next at 11,000, Georgetown 3,200, Milton 1,800, Acton 1,200, Esquesing 1,000 and Nantassagawa 400.

Of this total, nearly 22,000 are in public schools, while high schools expect to enroll 8,000. The remainder will attend R.C. separate schools and retarded children's schools. Many more will be heading for universities outside the county later in the month.
