Test Your Knowledge With Parliament Quiz

With parliament opening soon, public attention will be focused on Ottawa and the important events that will help decide Canada's future. The following Political News Quiz should test the knowledge and be fun for all members of the family. Ten questions about recent political events are included and should not be difficult for those who keep up to date with federal affairs. Three choices are offered as the answer for each question. Select either a, b or c and then check your knowledge against the correct answers which will be found on another page of this issue.

1. When parliament convenes on September 27th, the Conservative party will be the largest one in the Commons with 218 members. Second largest will be the Liberals who have: (a) 90 members, (b) 103, (c) 100.
2. The New Democratic Party elected 10 members of June 18. When parliament opens they will be represented by only 18 because — (a) leader T. C. Douglas resigned his Reg. seat; (b) Erhart Regier resigned his Burnaby-Coquitlam seat; (c) their winning candidate in Stormont died.
3. ONE PARTY THAT was not represented at all in the last parliament will be the 3rd largest in the new House. Social Credit elected a total of 30 members and they include: (a) 19 from Quebec and 11 from Alberta; (b) 26 from Quebec, 3 from Alberta and two from B.C.; (c) 12 from Alberta; 2 from B.C. and 16 from Quebec.
4. SINCE THE ELECTION prime minister Diefenbaker has made some cabinet changes. One of the most important was to transfer Donald Fleming from minister of finance to (a) minister of national revenue; (b) minister of public works; (c) minister of justice.

Select Carolyn Gardhouse As Halton 4-H Candidate

Carolyn Gardhouse, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Reford Gardhouse, 5th line, has been selected as a delegate to the National 4-H Club Week. She is one of seven 4-H club members in Ontario selected to represent 4-H Agricultural clubs. National 4-H Club Week is sponsored by the Canadian Council on 4-H clubs. Each year 14 delegates from each province in Canada are brought together for a "one week" tour at the time of the Royal Winter Fair. The selection is made on the basis of overall participation in 4-H Club work, and by a selection interview. Carolyn has completed sixteen 4-H Agricultural Club projects. These projects included seven Beef Cattle, five potato, three forage and one forestry club. It is interesting that in nine of these projects she either was first in the club or runner up. She has consistently been selected to take part in the Queen's Guiness Competition at the Royal Winter Fair. On two occasions she was a member of a 4-H team from Halton at the Provincial Inter-Club Competitions at Guelph. In the Provincial competitions she was on the second place team in grain judging in 1960, and third place beef judging team in 1960. Miss Gardhouse is presently studying for her degree in Household Science at Macdonald Institute, Guelph.
